HOMECOMING Weekend in Review

The weekend of May 5 & 6, 2006 saw hundreds of current and former students converging in one place to celebrate something they all have in common – the UCA experience.

The Programs

The weekend began with a welcome reception celebrating UCA's 60th anniversary. Guests enjoyed soft music and refreshments during this time, which provided an unstructured opportunity to reconnect and talk with friends. The 10-year honor class, '96, presented vespers with a focus on God's gifts and where those gifts have taken them.

The program on Sabbath featured representatives from '86, '81, '76, '66, '56, and from the first UCA graduating class-1946. Highlights from the service included a choral invitation to worship by the Class of '66 Chorale, the prayer was offered by current and former students in their mother tongues: English, Korean, Samoan, Spanish and Zulu. Special music was provided by the original quartet from the class of 1976. Dr. Mic Walter '66 shared some of his experiences as an Army Reserves chaplain in Iraq and Paster Phil White '76 delivered the morning message.

Also celebrated during the Sabbath service were the many years of service in Christian Education given by retiring staff members Phyllis Starr Bretsch, Jerry and Harriet Lange, and Ron Turner '59. Their contributions to the success of UCA and to many individual students through the years are a worthy legacy. The fruit of their efforts will continue on through the students they taught and worked with.

The Project

Every year alumni support at least one or more projects to benefit the school. In 2006, inspired by our students who brought home the \$25,000 Academy of Excellence Award, and a \$50,000 matching grant from an alumnus, the offering was dedicated to purchasing reliable busses to transport our students.

In the offering appeal, Joe Tua '08 also thanked those who make worthy student funds available to make UCA possible for him and fellow students who could not otherwise be there.

Honor Classes Choose Reunion Gifts

The class of 1986 set up a Memorial Scholarship at UCA, and the class of '96 provided funds to have a brass plaque made to identify their senior class gift, the new campus sign installed a couple of years ago. Our newest Alumni, the Senior Class of 2006 gave \$2,500 to speed the process of buying a new bus.

In addition, the class of 1970 has been working on replacing the sign they had made 35+ years ago, to identify their senior class gift which is the tall stand of Poplar trees beside the Industrial Education building. The overflow funds were donated to UCA's Worthy Student Fund.

UCA Named 2006 Academy of Excellence

The Alumni Awards Foundation based in Scottsdale, Arizona chose UCA as the 2006 winner of its prestigious Academy of Excellence Award, in February of this year.

The Awards Foundation was established by alumni of Adventist schools who, through financial awards to outstanding academies and teachers, seek to affirm and expand the excellence that already exists within our educational system.

In order to qualify, schools have to go through a rigorous screening process. Chaired by Cheri Corder, Communication Director, a committee of staff and students was formed to meet the detailed requirements. The initial application was an inch thick because it had to include accreditation reports, test scores, documentation on how the school is meeting the goals and objectives of the North American Division, and a description of innovative programs in place at our school.

Four schools were chosen to go on to the second phase of the selection process which included a four hour site visit by representatives from the Awards Foundation Board. Three of those four schools were then invited to participate in the Alumni Awards Convention in Arizona.

When researching the cost of flying the team to Arizona, the Development Office contacted Southwest Airlines. When they learned of the award, they offered to donate two of the 9 tickets, because they wanted to be a part of the celebration! '08 from Spokane; Christopher Patchett '07 from Marshfield, WI; Cody Lonning '06 from Cheney, WA; and Aric Vyhmeister '06 from Apopka, FL. Faculty sponsors were Jeff and Marianne Bovee, principal and accountant, and Roxanne Fleck Wickward '84, history teacher.

Hosting one of the holes at the golf tournament, staffing a booth and two ten minute presentations were required of each school.

Student talks, live music and short video clips about UCA were methods by which our committee chose to showcase the best of UCA. During her remarks, Shari Fogelquist told the convention crowd, "UCA offers all the basics and many outstanding extras, but what makes it truly excellent is the relationships we have with our teachers, with each other and all the opportunities we have to build a relationship with God."

The week end convention culminated in a banquet where those in attendance voted for the school they thought best exhibited excellence. Scores from the three phases of the selection process were then tabulated and the winner announced.

"We were very excited to receive first place," beamed Principal Jeff Bovee. "We have a dynamite staff who has built up an outstanding program over the years, and our students are the greatest – I'm really proud of them!"

On the way home, in appreciation for Southwest Airlines donated tickets, Aric and Chris did a violin and French Horn concert at 32,000 feet!

Along with the "Academy of Excellence"

title and the honor of using the Academy of Excellence logo, came a generous check for \$25,000 from the Foundation. Also honored in the closing ceremony were Highland View Academy of Hagerstown, MD (\$20,000/2nd place) and Highland Academy of Portland, TN (\$15,000/3rd place). Nine teachers, one administrator and three alumni from across North America were also honored.

UCA is one of one hundred and ten academies in the North American Division with an enrollment of 270 students at the time of the award.

The UCA Year In Review

Attending UCA is often a life changing experience. In the space below, we'd like to share with you some of the things that made last school year memorable.

- In response to the devastation brought by Hurricane Katrina, officers of the student body called a special assembly to brainstorm ideas of how the students could help. As a result, the students voted to forgo their fall picnic at Camp MiVoden. With this action, they saved \$1,500 in transportation costs which were donated to the Adventist Community Services Disaster Response Fund.

- Although students lent their support to Katrina victims, they still wanted to do more! And so the idea of a student-led fundraising banquet was born. The gym was transformed into a dining hall, while students, dressed in formal attire, greeted and escorted the guests to their places. From arranging for a guest speaker and caterer to extending invitations and providing musical entertainment, this was a student driven event.



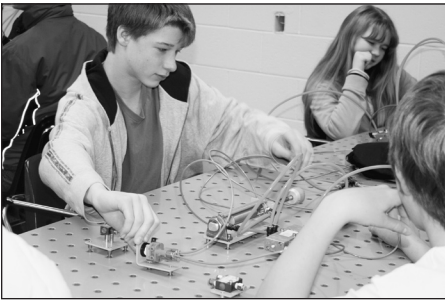

- For 14 years UCA students and staff have donated an average of 8,500 hours a year for community service. On any given HOPE Taskforce day, 25 to 30 organizations and individuals experience the energy and enthusiasm of Adventist Christian young people, out to make a difference in their world.

- UCA continues the long-standing tradition of Senior Survival. The senior class spends nearly a week in the “wilderness” near Camp MiVoden, learning to live in accommodations much less desirable than the dorm. Through it all—plastic tents, scorched campfire food, team building activities and spiritual growth through the study of end time events—the students bond, connecting with God and each other. One of the Seniors said, “We want to bring everyone at the school together in the same way that our class has come together.”

- Every other year UCA hosts a Technology Fair. Last November 180 seventh through 10th graders converged on campus to take advantage of workshops in the areas of auto CAD, automotive, aviation, creative threads, desktop publishing, photography, robotics and welding. Instructors from Walla Walla College, Spokane Community College, and UCA students and staff facilitated hands on experiences in the classes that UCA offers in an on going program. Chuck Paulson, event organizer and head of UCA’s technology program said, “We want our young people to get excited about technology. But most of all, we want them to get excited about Christian education. The Lord has blessed us with a technology program that helps make that happen.”

- Students always look forward to being involved in the mission trips organized by UCA. On their seventh annual church-building trip to Sarawak, Borneo, headed up by Olin Peach, participants learned that their involvement brought unexpected results. In addition to operating medical clinics, building two churches and holding an evangelistic series and VBS programs, the group learned that they were also an inspiration for others. Elder Gilbert Tan, the Executive Secretary of the Sarawak Adventist Mission reported: “You have inspired our own young people to work for the Lord in their country. They figured if you were willing to travel half-way around the world to work for God here, they could certainly build churches too! They have followed your example, and built two churches as well.

- The annual Spring Marine Biology study trip is a popular perk for those taking the class. During their 4 day stay at the Rosario Field Station, students participated in beach transects, studies at a research center, tide pooling and observed orca vocalization studies. To top it off, they visited the Seattle Aquarium and were able to study the wealth of living creatures there. Said trip organizer, Gayle Haeger, “Many of them expressed awe over seeing the variety God had created.

The End of an Era

If you think of the music program at UCA, you're likely to think of Jerry Lange. It's as if he's always been here—encouraging and cheering his students on to musical excellence. But now, big changes have come to this campus. After nearly a lifetime of service to UCA, Jerry Lange, head of the music department, has retired.

During Alumni Weekend, a farewell tribute was planned to honor the contribution of both Jerry and his wife, Harriet who taught computer classes and tirelessly supported the music education. The programs included the shared admiration and memories from many individuals—from Jerry's academy principal and former bosses to grateful students. The Lange's were also presented Alumni Werth Award. The Alumni Committee initiated this award a decade ago, as a way to honor teachers who have given at least 10 years of outstanding service to UCA. With 37 years under his belt—Mr. Lange certainly qualifies.

Under Mr. Lange's leadership, the music department has become recognized as one of the leading academy music programs in the country. Known for his band and ensembles, emphasis has always been placed on helping students improve as individuals. To that end, Mr. Lange has personally given over 62,000 private lessons.

He has directed workshops at teachers' conventions and developed Music Festival programs. He presided over a renovation and expansion of the music building and established a scholarship fund for gifted musicians that has awarded over \$50,000 since 2002. He began the first music technology program in any academy, built a recording studio, and trained students in a four-lab multi-media center using the latest software.

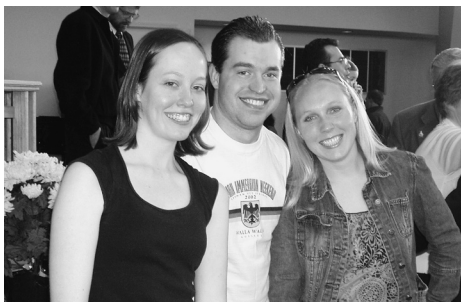

Yakima Valley Academy Students Enjoy Granger Centennial

Under a big white tent and old spreading Maple trees, on the lawn beside their aging school, almost fifty former Yakima Valley Academy students from 1925 to the final graduating class of 1945, gathered to pay tribute to a special time in their lives. They were joined by several hundred former Granger church members as they celebrated the Centennial of the church they all attended. Old hymns and great music, interviews, story time, and rich worship services were the order of the day... they talked long into the warm summer Friday evening.

Old pictures and familiar faces brought back memories of long hours of hard work, secret notes lowered through cracks in the screens on long pieces of precious, hoarded string, to the floor below where the "other side of the campus" lived... stories of night watchmen and bakery pranks, penny nails on the rail road tracks, picnics and trips to the swimming hole and special times of spiritual growth and bonding. One 87 year old alumnus shared that he got paid 9 cents an hour at his job... but then tuition was only \$15 a month.

The weekend was a "sentimental journey" for the YVA students, who realized this was probably their last time to visit their alma mater. Sabbath afternoon self-guided tours through the building were a popular activity, since it is slated for demolition within the next year.

Initially a railroad hotel to serve the expanding population moving west by train, the hotel later became a Seventh-day Adventist boarding academy for the young people of Upper Columbia Conference, beginning in the early 1920's. Outgrowing its capacity, the Academy closed in 1945 and many of those remaining freshmen, sophomores and juniors came to the new school, Upper Columbia Academy.

The school building was sold some years back and is currently being used as a Spanish radio station. When the landmark is demolished, a new radio station and community center will be built to serve the growing Latino population. Where dear old YVA now stands, there will be landscaping, a waterfall and tables and benches. A room in the center will be designated as an archival spot for pictures and paintings of past and present life in Granger - a reminder of those "good old days."

Alumni Match Two Commonweal Foundation Grants

Last winter in order to bring our classrooms into line with the goals of UCA's emerging Master Plan, the Development office wrote two grants totaling almost \$50,000 for equipment that would upgrade classrooms teaching core academic subjects, with the latest in teaching technology. "We want each student to be able to understand what they are taught, regardless of their learning style," said Linnea Torkelsen, Director. The grants were approved in the late spring, and with the help of Alumni, UCA was able to provide 25% of the total, required by the granting organization.

Five classrooms received Elmo visual presenters, a lap top computer, an overhead video projector, a daylight screen and an equipment cart. "Having this kind of technology will provide us with on the spot flexibility to customize and adapt lessons quickly," said one teacher. "Lessons will come alive, because we will have the ability to add pictures, artifacts, video clips and database research from unlimited resources.... AND, this equipment will make it easy for us to show our students HOW to study."

Also in line with the academic portion of our Master Plan, UCA is moving toward upgrading our science offerings. Because of a second Commonweal Foundation Grant, also matched in part by Alumni, the Chemistry and Physics Departments were able to purchase "Probeware" to expand our interactive laboratory experiences. The goal is to make Chemistry and Physics less intimidating and more interesting to a greater number of students, while assuring a stimulating academic atmosphere with cutting-edge technology.

The advantage of having the "Probeware" technology is that it allows experiments to be done quickly, allowing students to measure, analyze and to view their results in "real time" on a computer screen with immediate feedback and reinforcement - a process that might otherwise take hours or days. "Now, instead of having to read about an experiment because of time constraints, students can experience it for themselves," says teacher Charles Harman, "with time left over for additional instruction."

Alumni Meet Fifty Thousand Dollar Bus Match!

In affirmation of UCA's new status as The 2006 Academy of Excellence, an anonymous alumnus offered a matching grant for fellow Alumni and friends of the school, who would give the last \$50,000 needed to purchase a good used bus. The first \$4,000 came in the Alumni weekend morning offering, and the seniors added \$2500 - their parting class gift, to help get the bus faster. (After they broke down on their senior trip out in the middle of nowhere, their vote on what to do for UCA, was sealed!)

Appeal letters went out at the end of June to 4600 former YVA and UCA students. As of September, a little more than four months after launching the project, the goal has been met. The final amount came all in one gift of \$16,000 from someone who walked into the Principal's office and asked how much more we needed... then sat down and wrote out a check on the spot for the whole amount. A miracle!

Bus #1 - a 1973 vintage model, will soon be replaced by a completely refurbished beautiful 1994 Privost top of the line Canadian - made, 56 passenger coach.

The retiring bus has over 1.2 million miles on it. Thank you to any of you who must have helped to provide them years ago... and now to those of you who are making its' replacement possible!

Bus #2 - a 1978 vintage model, needs to be retired as well. The Associated Student Body is taking on the huge job of raising funds for it. Their kick off campaign is this month. When you hear from them, please encourage them as they embark on their first philanthropic effort to make a much needed difference for UCA!

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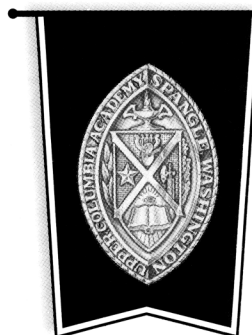
