UCA Honors the Memory of Olin Peach

Many of you are aware of the passing of UCA icon, Olin Peach. He was killed in a snowmobile accident while hauling firewood near his cabin in Joseph, Oregon – a cabin so often shared with outdoor education students before heading out on the trail. He had returned just days before, from leading his

14th mission trip to Sarawak, Borneo where the group built his 20th church. He died as he lived – full throttle. His funeral was held in the UCA church, and he is buried in the Spangle cemetery, overlooking the campus he served for so many years.

Mr. Peach began his journey at UCA in 1963. He "officially" retired in 1998, but continued to teach AP History classes for several years after that. Nothing could induce him though, to retire from organizing and leading out in Rec Ski and his legendary spring break mission trips



The 2010 Student Council proposed that the Power House be named in his honor. The UCA Board of Trustees voted unanimously to affirm the students' request. It will be known as The Olin J. Peach Power House. Since the Power House is "Mission trip planning headquarters," it seems appropriate that his name be attached to the place where our service

begins.

In addition, the Peach family has set up an endowed scholarship through the UCA Foundation. What's New at UCA

The 2010-2011 school year at Upper Columbia Academy (UCA) is underway with 257 students registered. Several new programs in place, promise to make this year better than ever!

- TIP Program: The leadership team at UCA is committed to Christian education, believing the rewards far outweigh the financial investment required. Wanting to make Adventist education more affordable for more kids, they created a program to do just that. The Tuition Incentive Program, or TIP, is a plan to reduce tuition in each successive year a student attends UCA. The first year is full price; the second comes with a 20% discount; the third is 30% off; the fourth is 50% off. Basically, if a student is a four-year senior, one year is free! - One-on-One Laptops: Computers have become the pen and pencil of academic instruction. This year, UCA will ensure that everyone has a uniform set of tools by providing a laptop to each student. Teachers will be able to give assignments knowing that each student has the resources needed to complete it. Students will turn in assignments electronically, with teachers checking and returning electronically, saving paper and printing costs.

Robust safeguards for content filtering will ensure students have access to the information they need, without access to inappropriate sites. In class, teachers can control student access via their own computers and monitor how students are using their computers in class.


- Fresh Eyes Committee: Because UCA desires excellence, at the suggestion of board chairman, Bob Folkenberg, Jr., a committee of business and management oriented friends of the school were invited to come to campus with the idea that those who don't see the campus daily, might, by looking at things through "fresh eyes," identifying areas where improvements could be made. The committee is focused on providing positive suggestions and guidance to the board and administration on improving the look and functionality of the campus, working in conjunction with the Master Plan Committee. Further reports will follow.
- Staff Transitions: Alumni Sidney Hardy, '95, and Bob Lenz, '03, are returning to UCA in a new capacity. Hardy will be teaching Bible while Lenz heads the IT Department. Also joining the staff is Kyle Gladding who will be teaching math. In-house transitions include current staff taking on new responsibilities: Chelle Jahn, '05, Attendance officer and HOPE Taskforce Director; Joe Hess, Director of Marketing and Recruitment; Pastor Ken Wetmore adds Freshman Bible to his pastoral duties.

Kohl's Facebook Campaign

On August 10, UCA became aware of the fact that we were eligible to participate in a \$10 million dollar give away sponsored by Kohl's department store. Though the contest had been in full swing for over a month, UCA jumped in because we HAD to try! The top 20 schools would get \$500,000 each, based on the number of votes generated on the internet's social networking site, Facebook.

On Friday, September 3 when the contest ended, UCA finished a strong #30. Though it was deeply disappointing that it wasn't enough, the miracle is, that a little Adventist school in the wheat fields of Washington, pulled through all the eligible schools in the nation to end at #30 - starting when they found out, just 3 1/2 weeks before the contest ended! Mt Ellis Academy learned about the contest almost a month before we did, and they ended in the 10th position in the top 20 - with 144,006 votes! Congratulations to our sister school, who will now have funds to re-do their sewer system.

Almost 9,500 people cast votes for UCA. If everyone who voted, gave \$50 over the next 5 months (\$10 a month) we'd have close to \$475,000 to kick off our campaign for building a new cafeteria, and money to do some renovations in our dorms.
