On my homeward trip I found out that Dorothy Skeels and Dolores Miller were teaching church school in Montana.

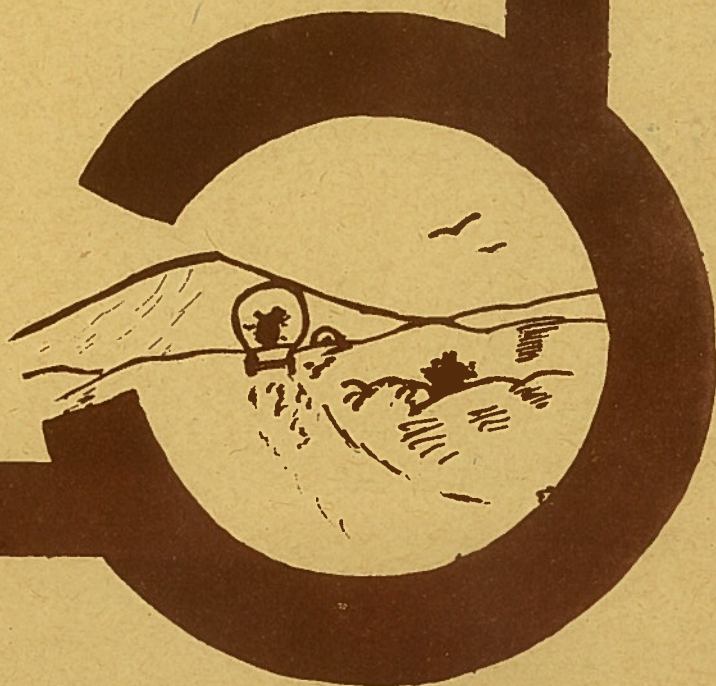
