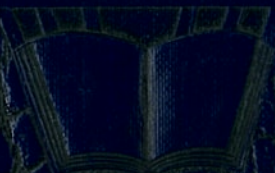

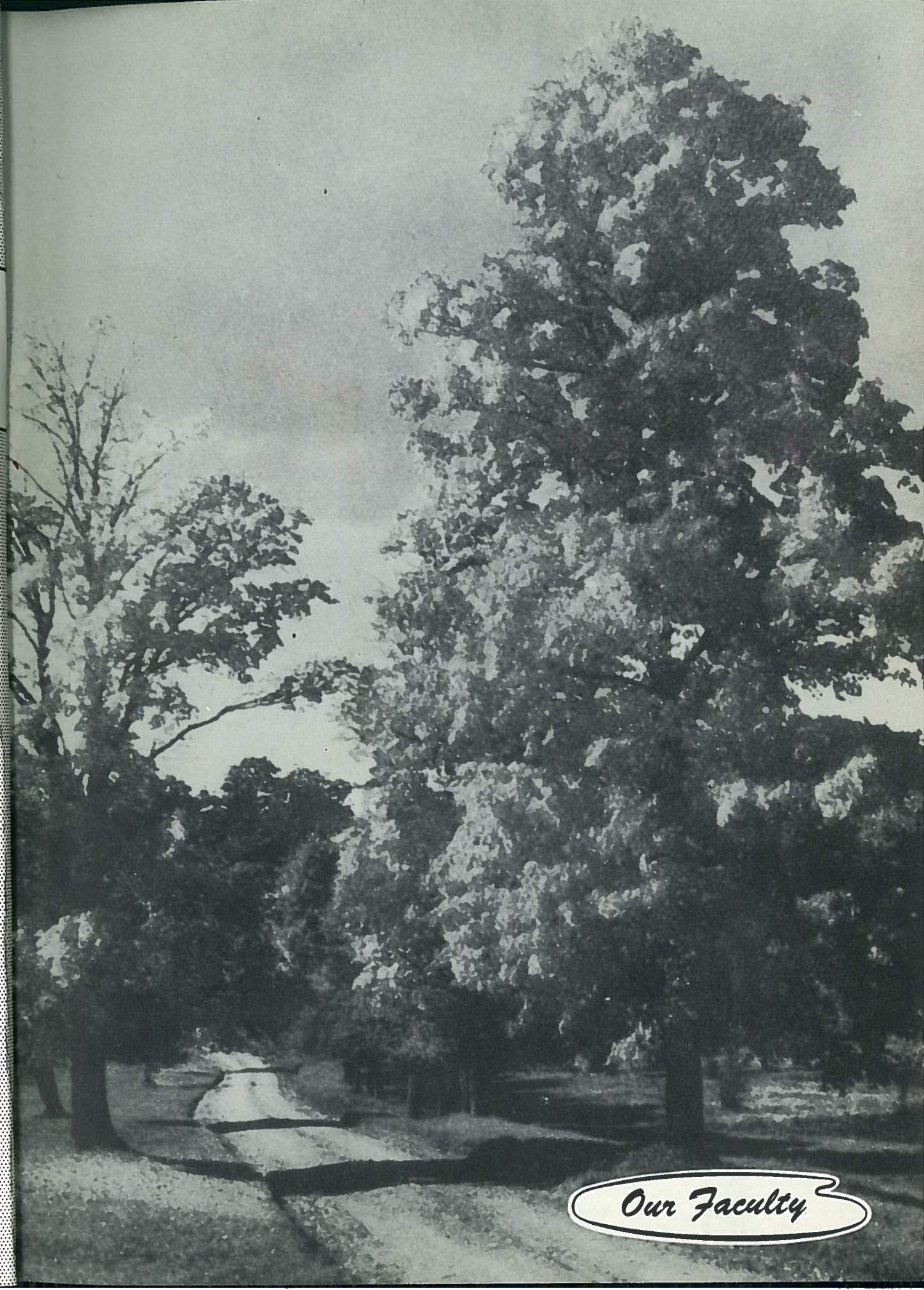


In Memory
