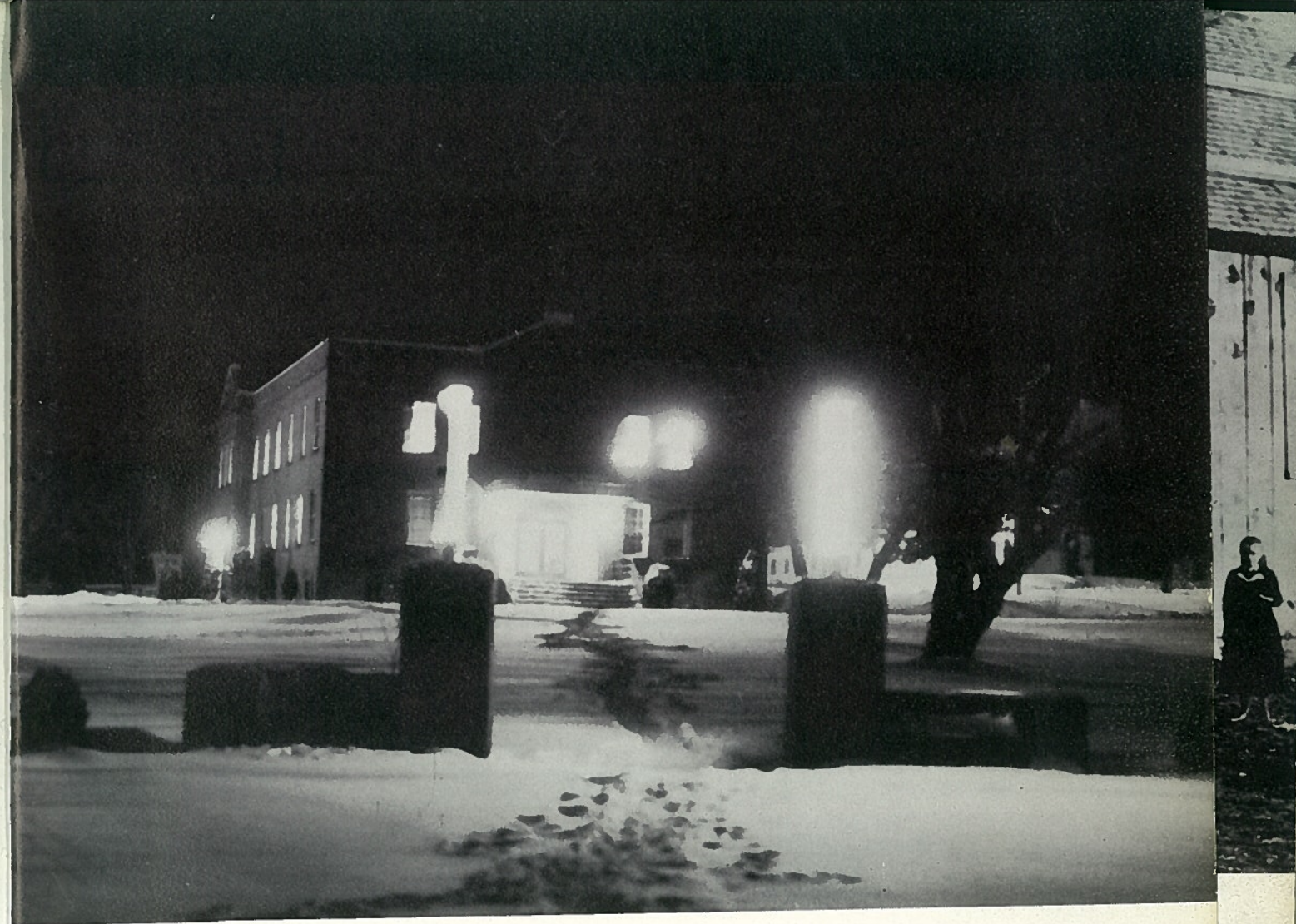

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

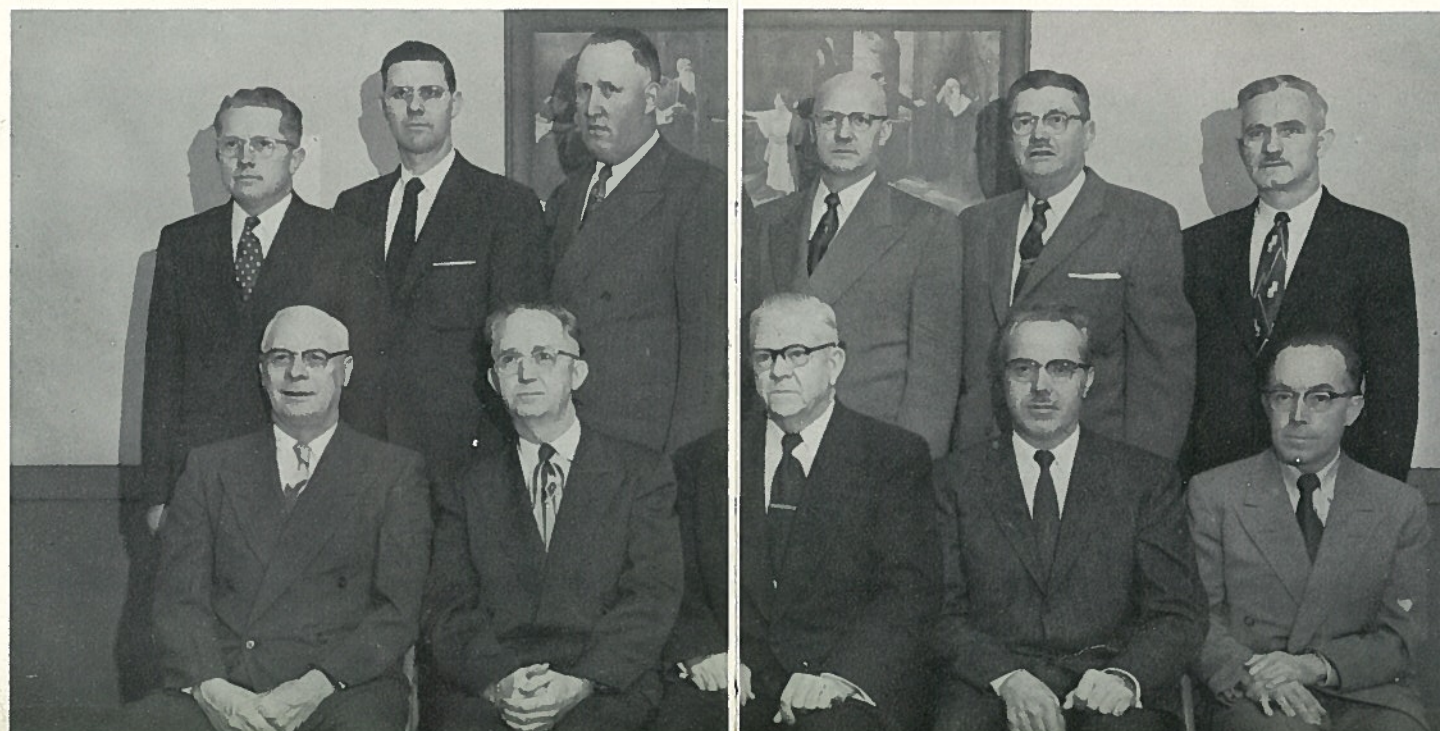
