This is the purpose for our annual, the 1953 ECHO LOG.

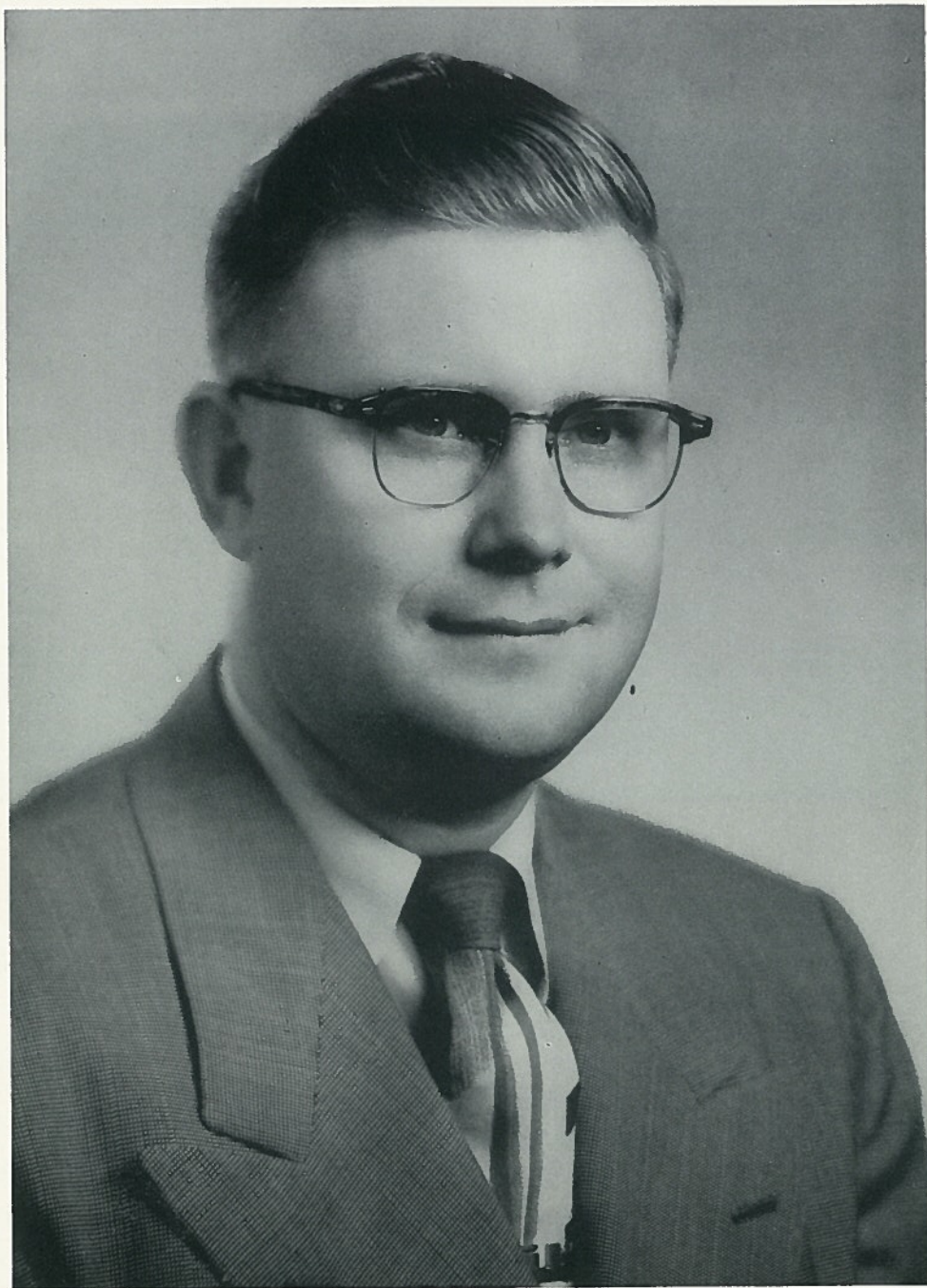


## Alma Mater

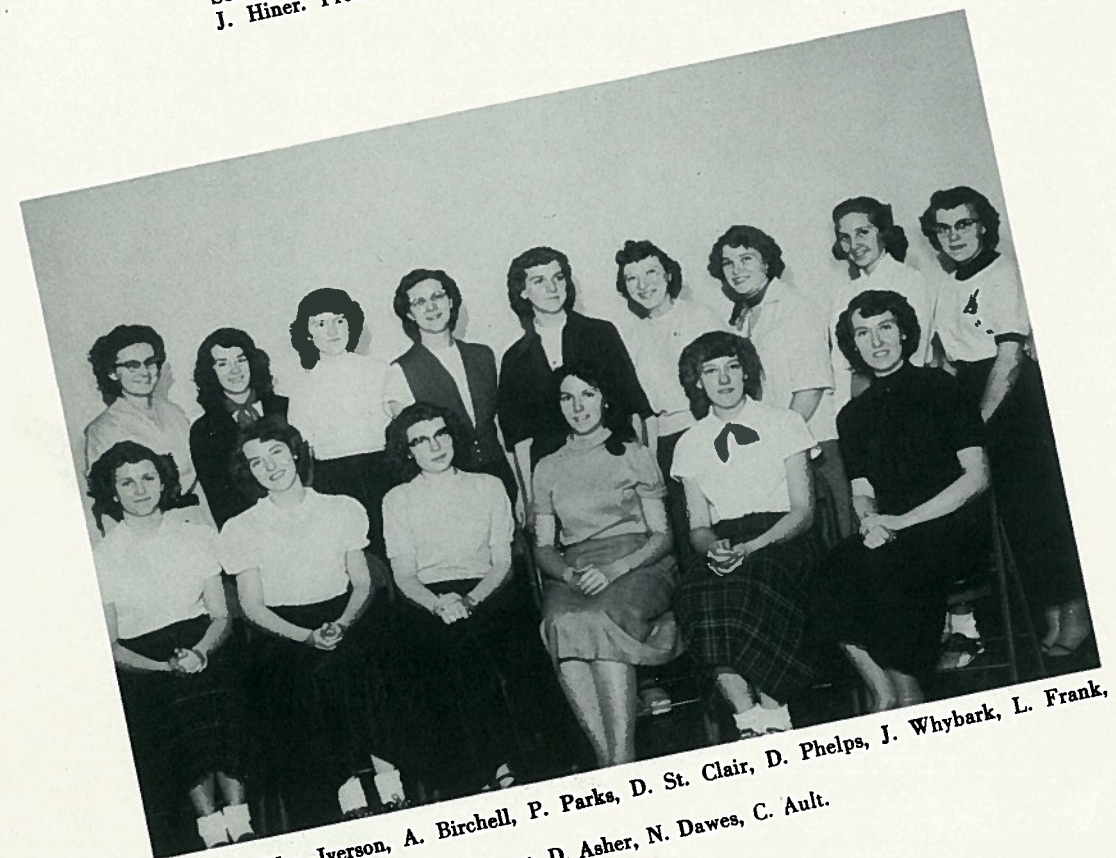
