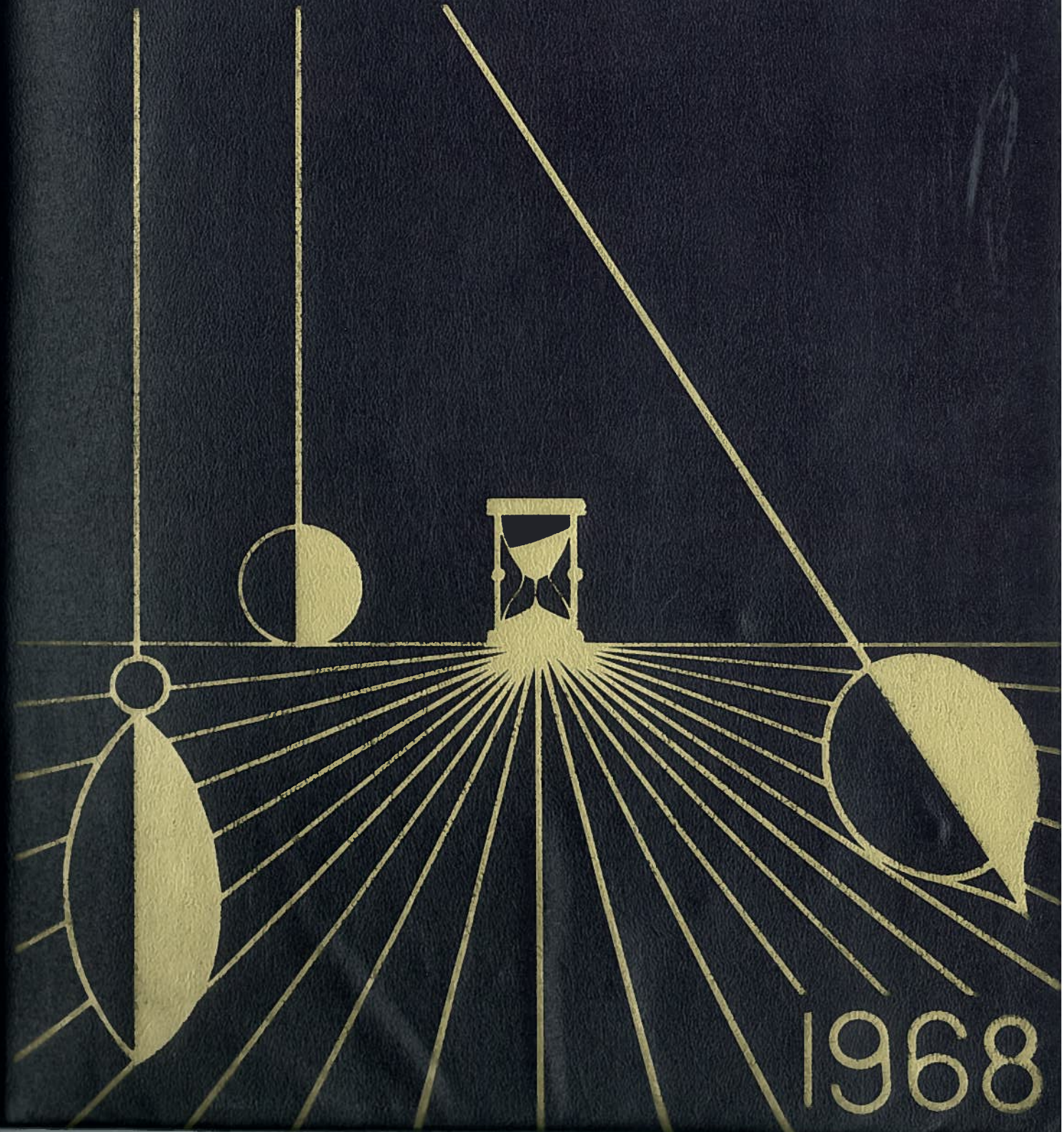

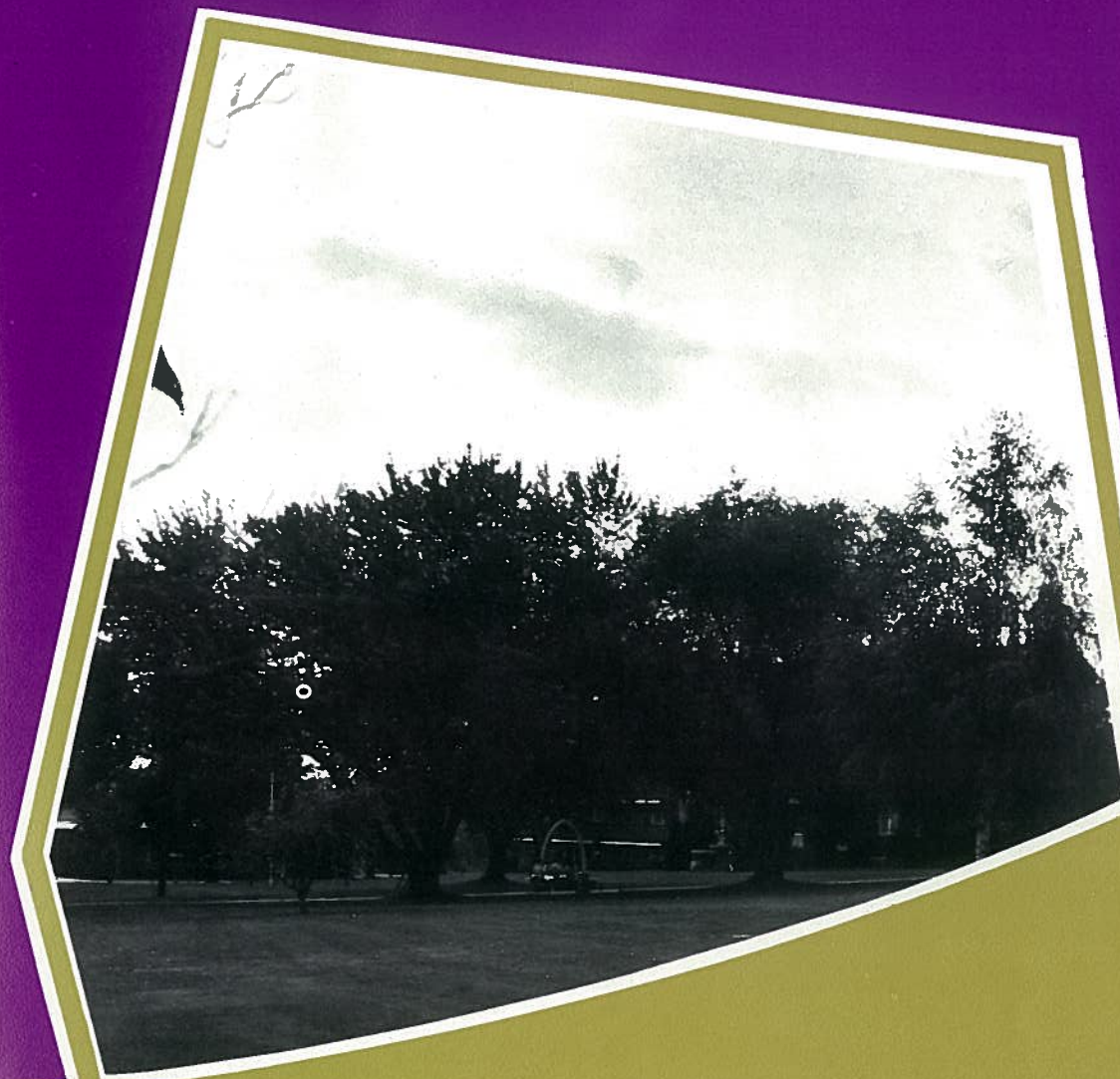

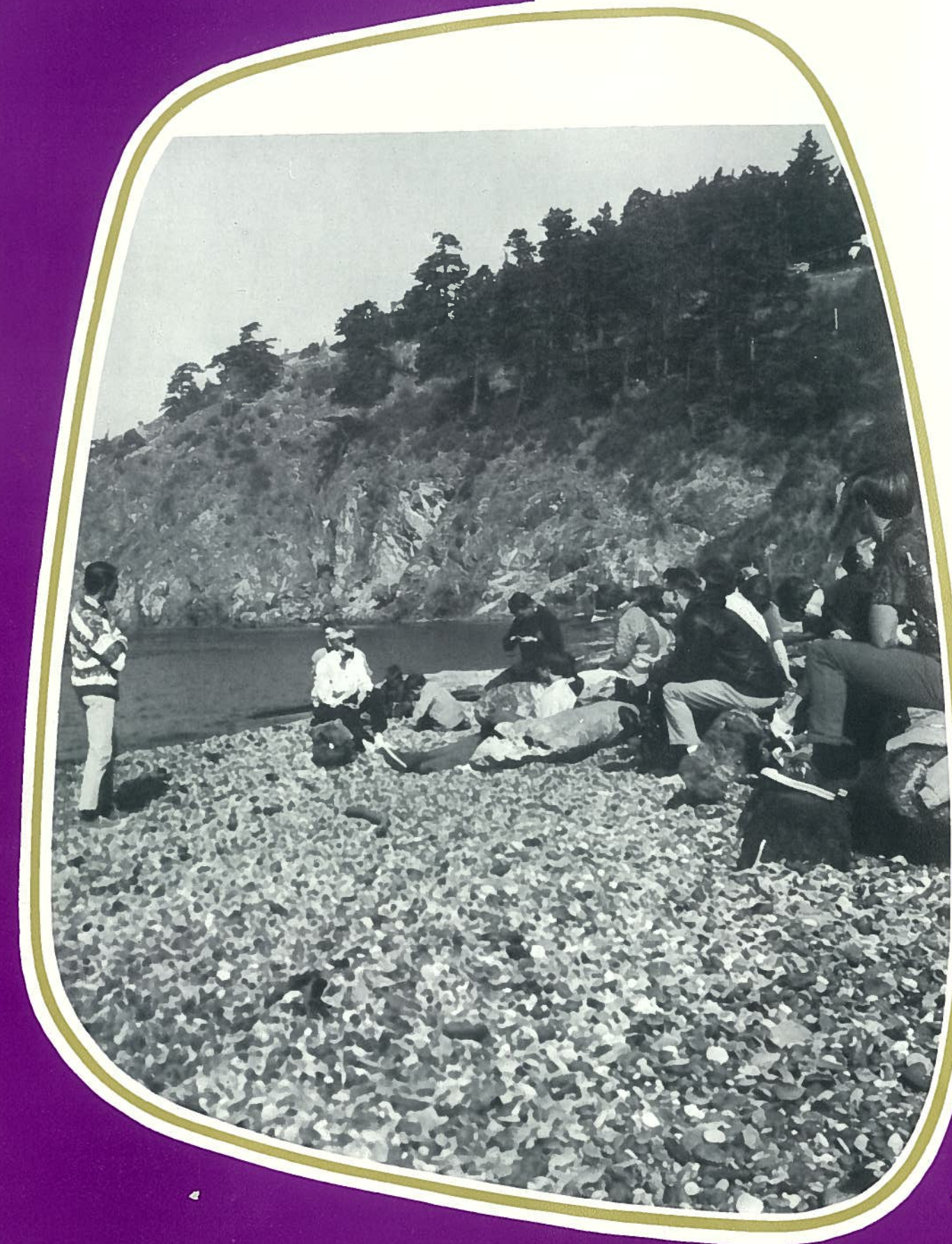

A TIME TO SERVE

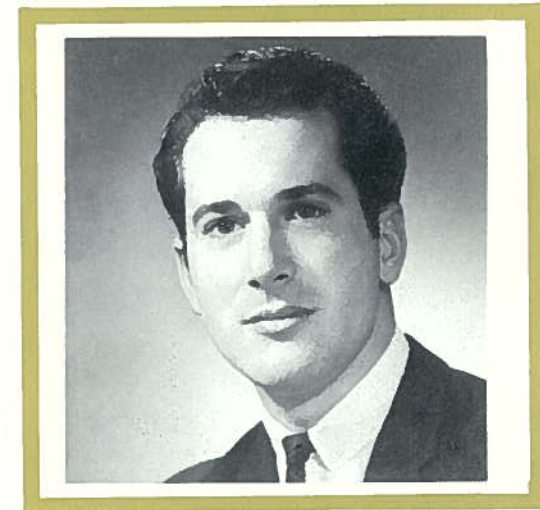

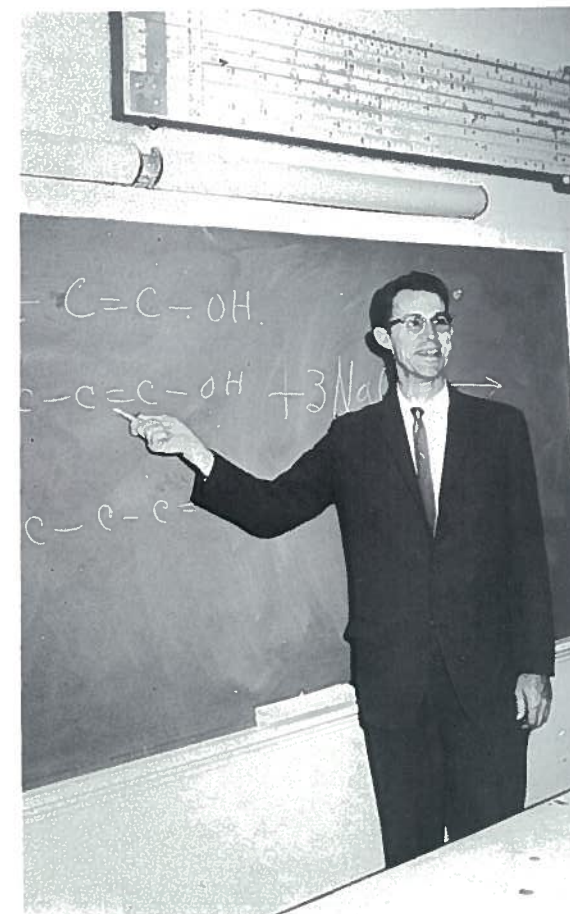
Elder Don Parks, who is our church pastor, also teaches Principles of Life, junior Bible, and Old Testament, freshman Bible.

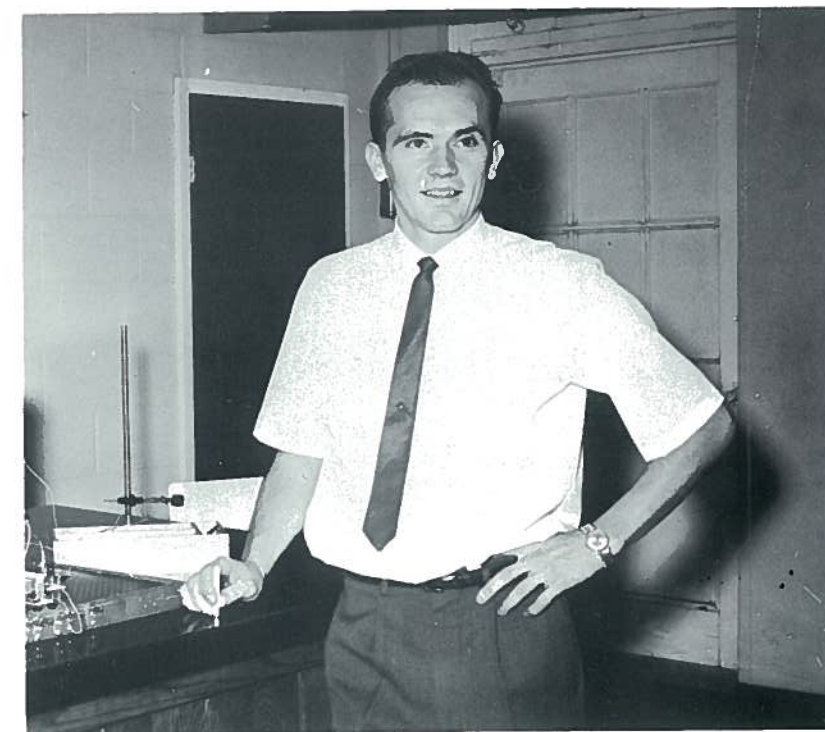

SCIENCE & MATHEMATICS

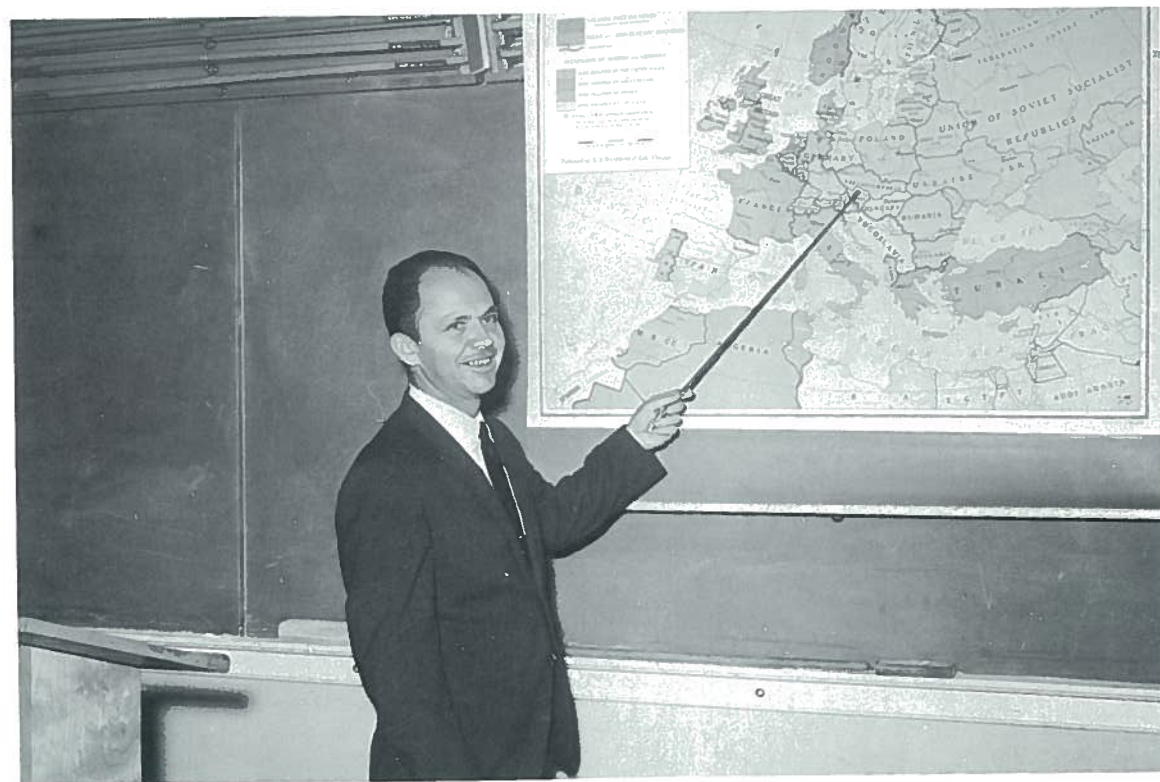

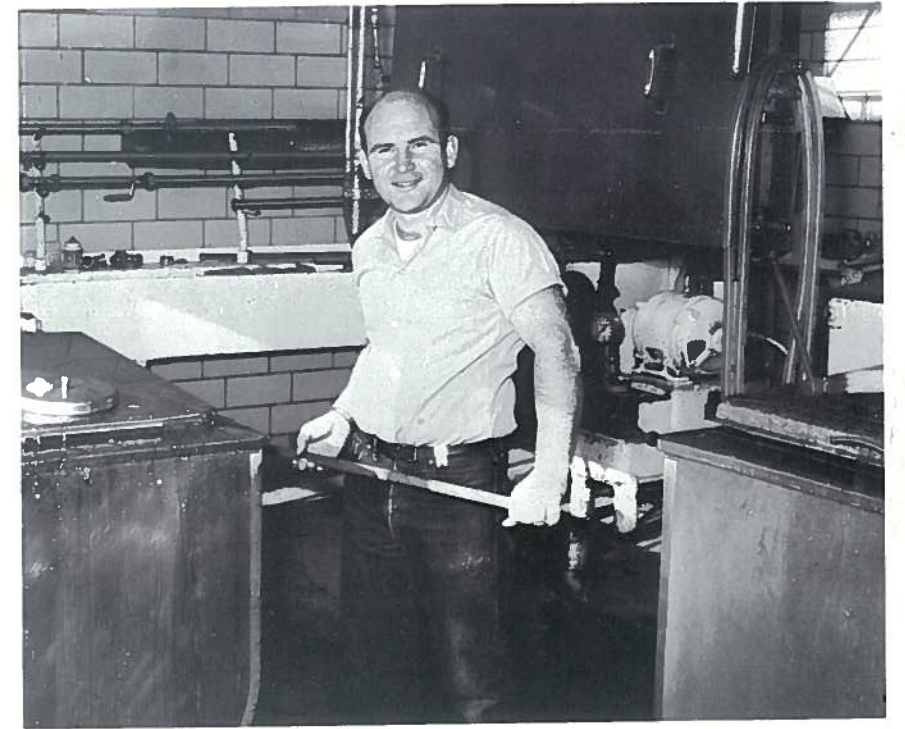
LIKE A CHILD

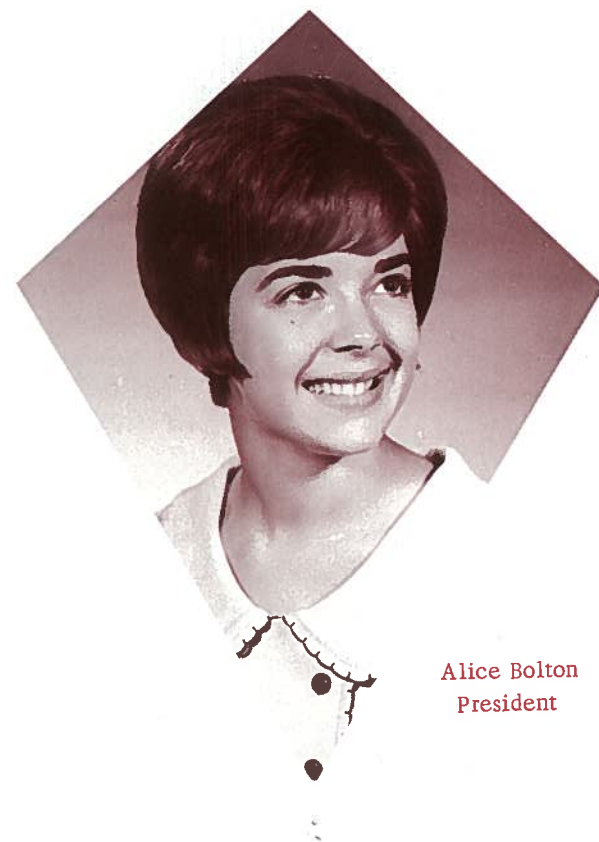
THE WORLD I USED TO KNOW
