


As each day passed, one by one, The things God made did grow; The birds, the trees, the animals, They all ran to and fro.









Each little thing He made so perfect, A purpose each to serve: To eat, to smell, to hear, to touch, God made each to observe.



Then God looked upon these things, And saw His perfect land. But He said, "There's something missing," So God created Man.















But lo, there came a sad, sad day, When all real beauty was lost. Man let sin enter in, They now would pay the cost.






Letter Campaign
