

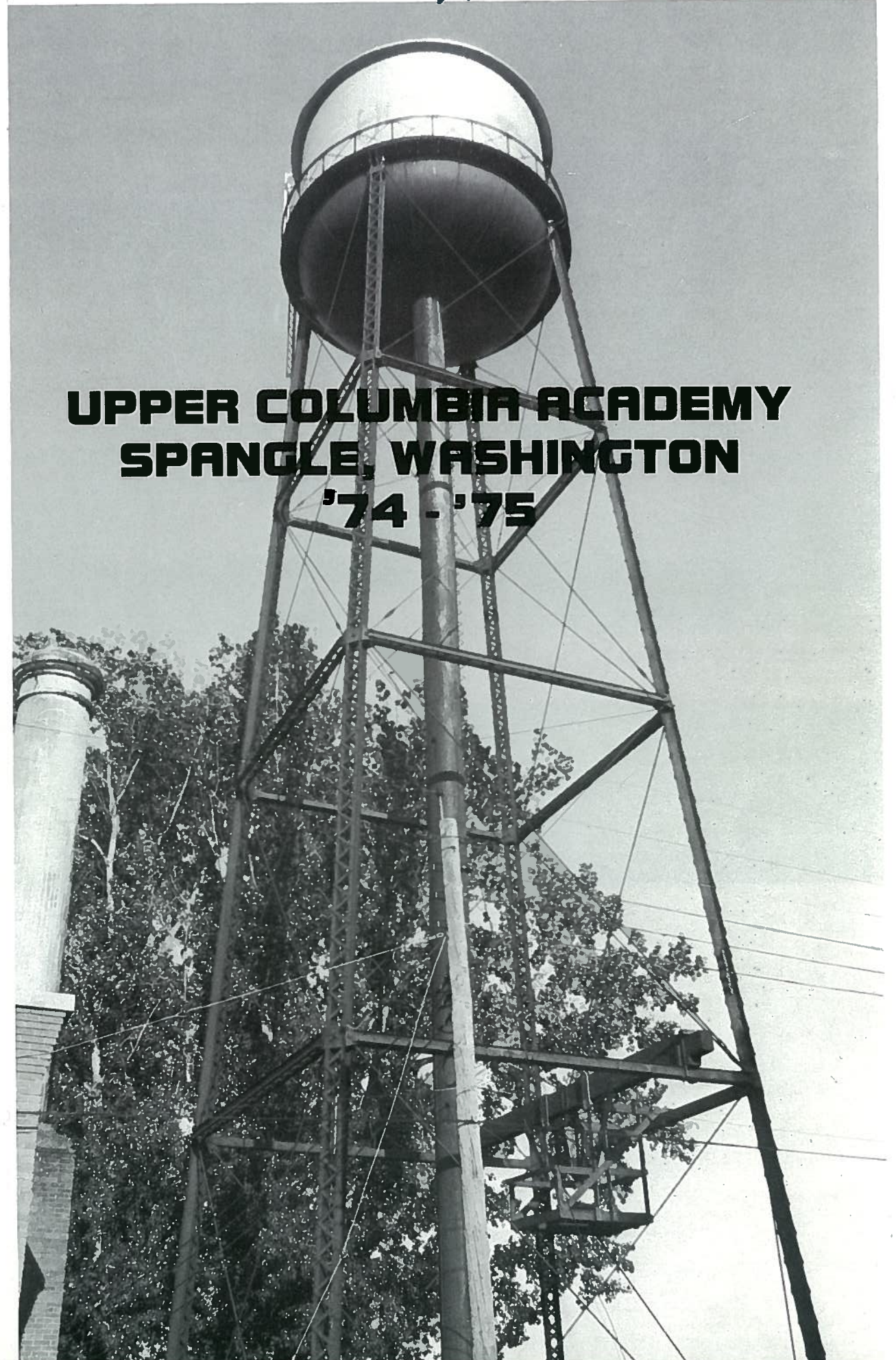

They all ran to and fro.

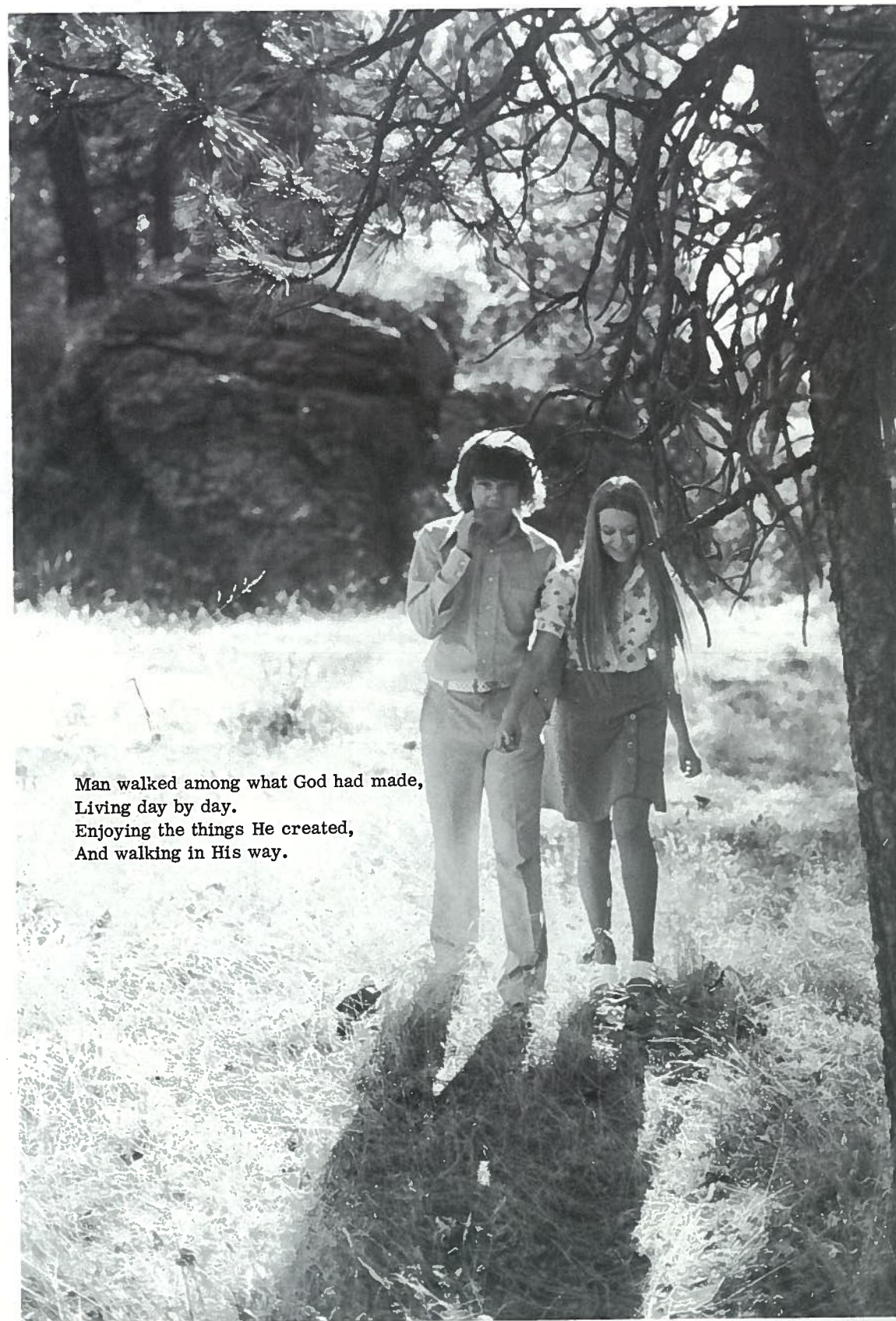


Each little thing He made so perfect,

And walking in His way.

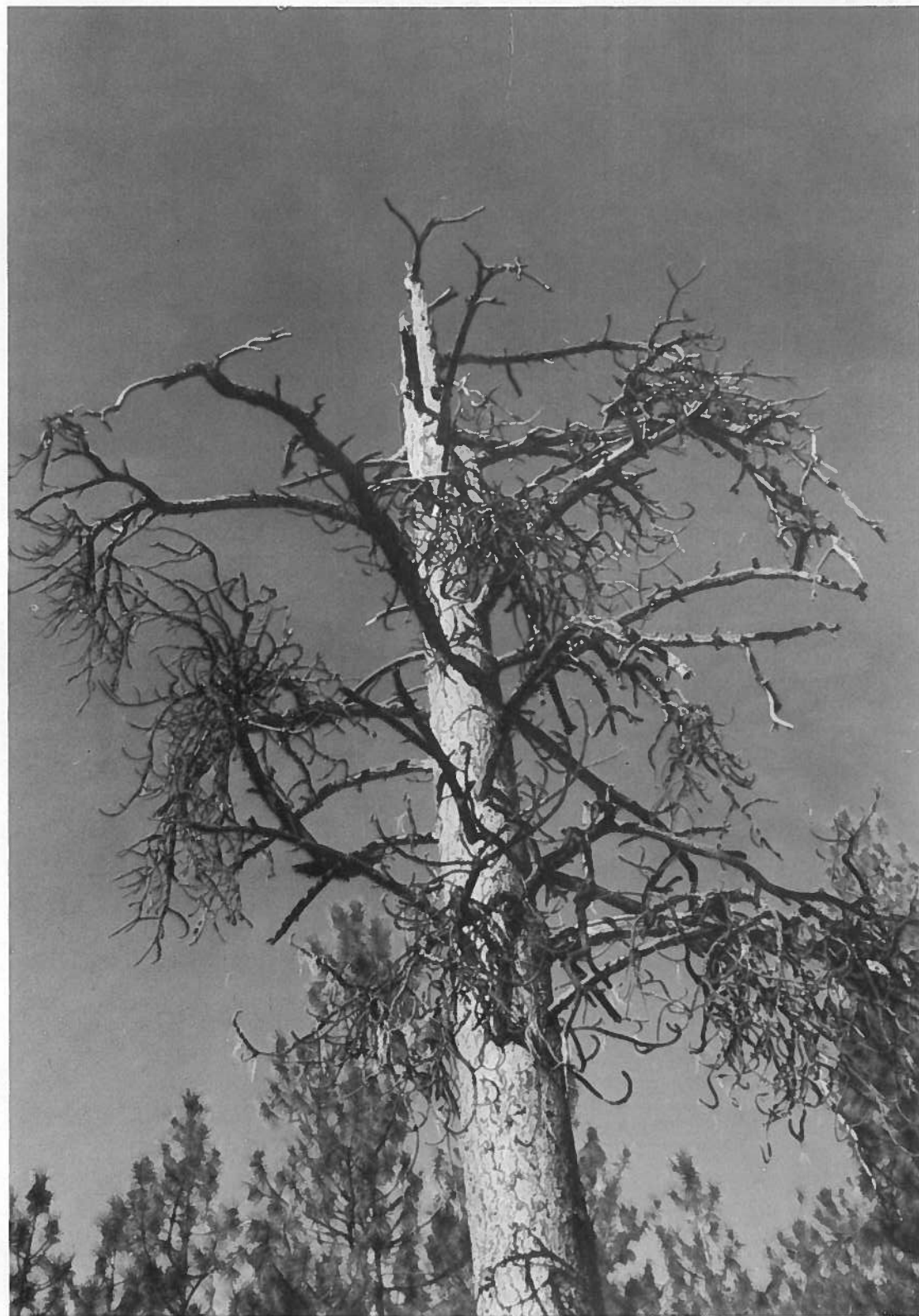
Now God had His perfect Earth,

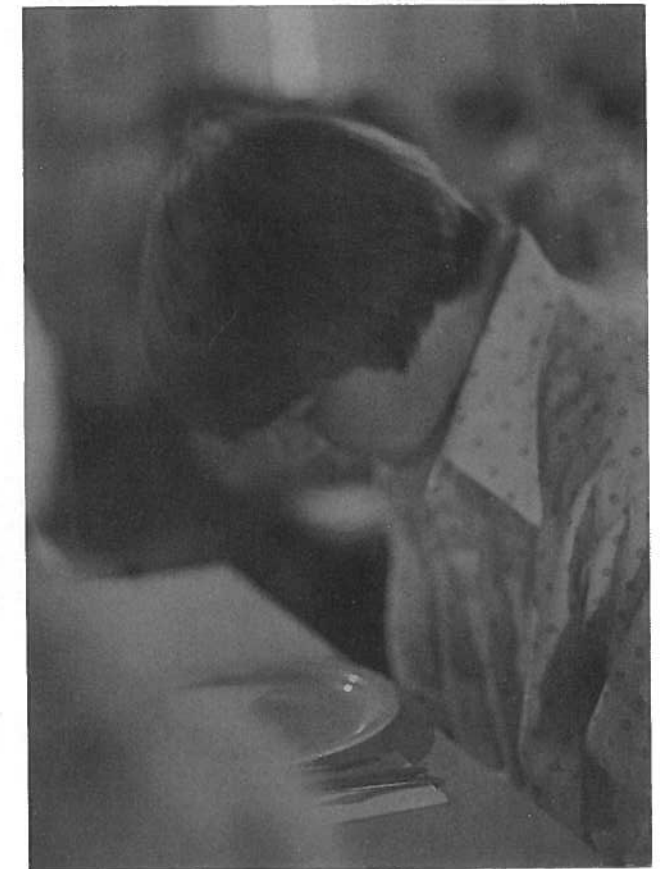
Handshake

Bible Conference

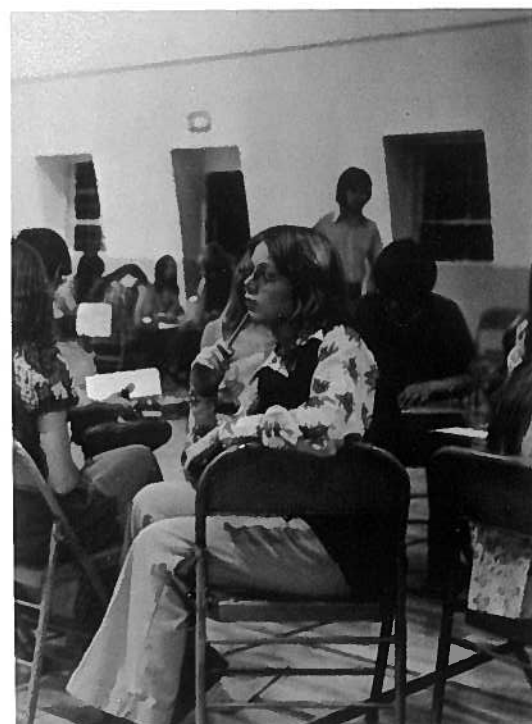
