Clowns score big at Festival

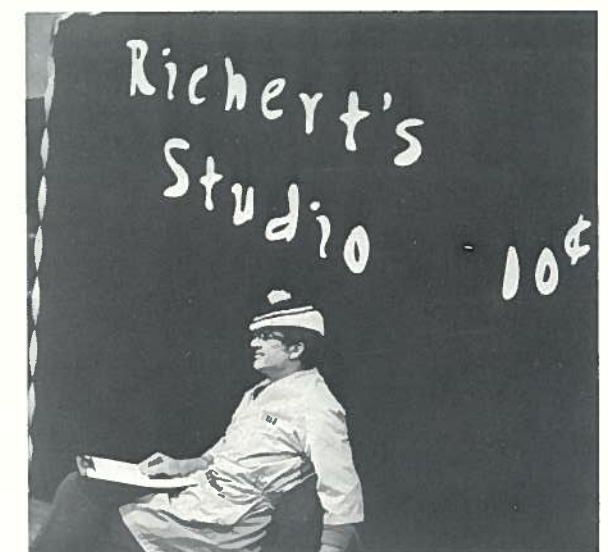

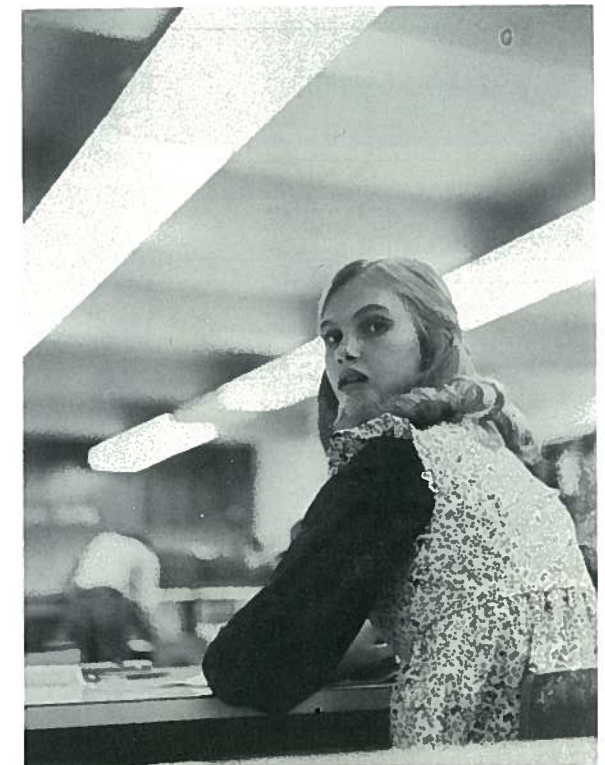
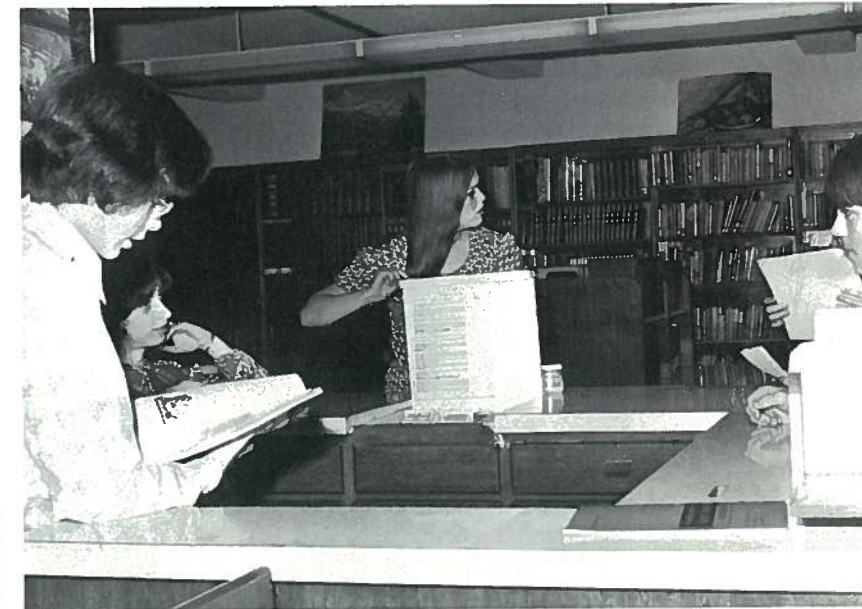
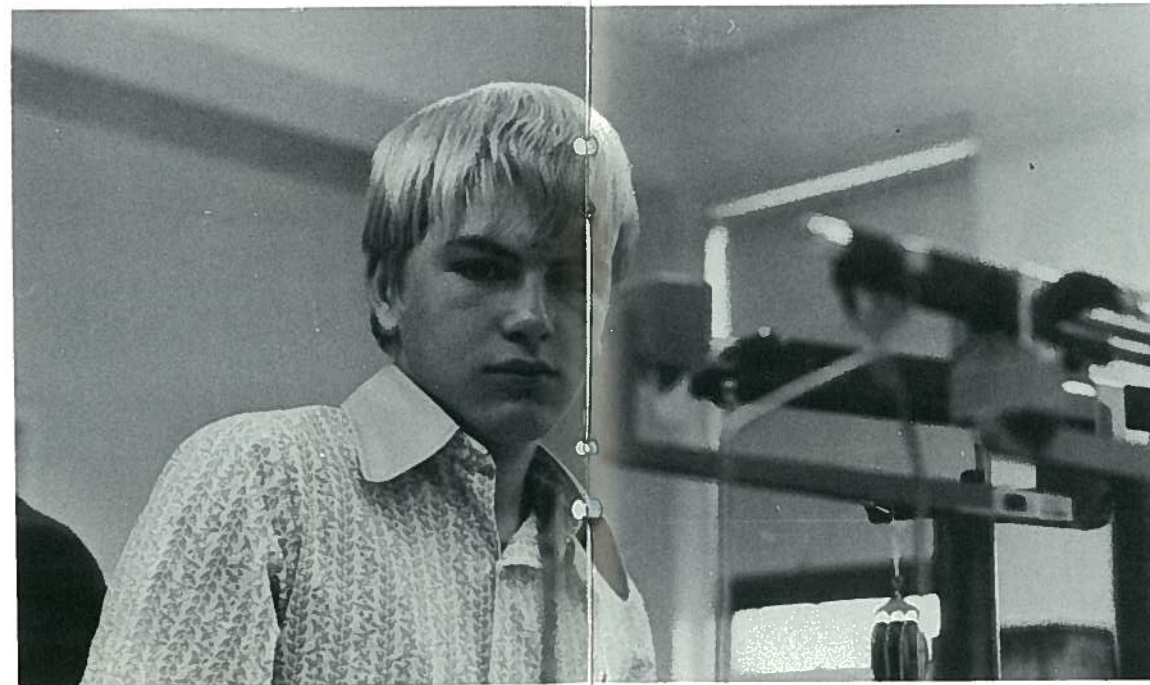
Morning

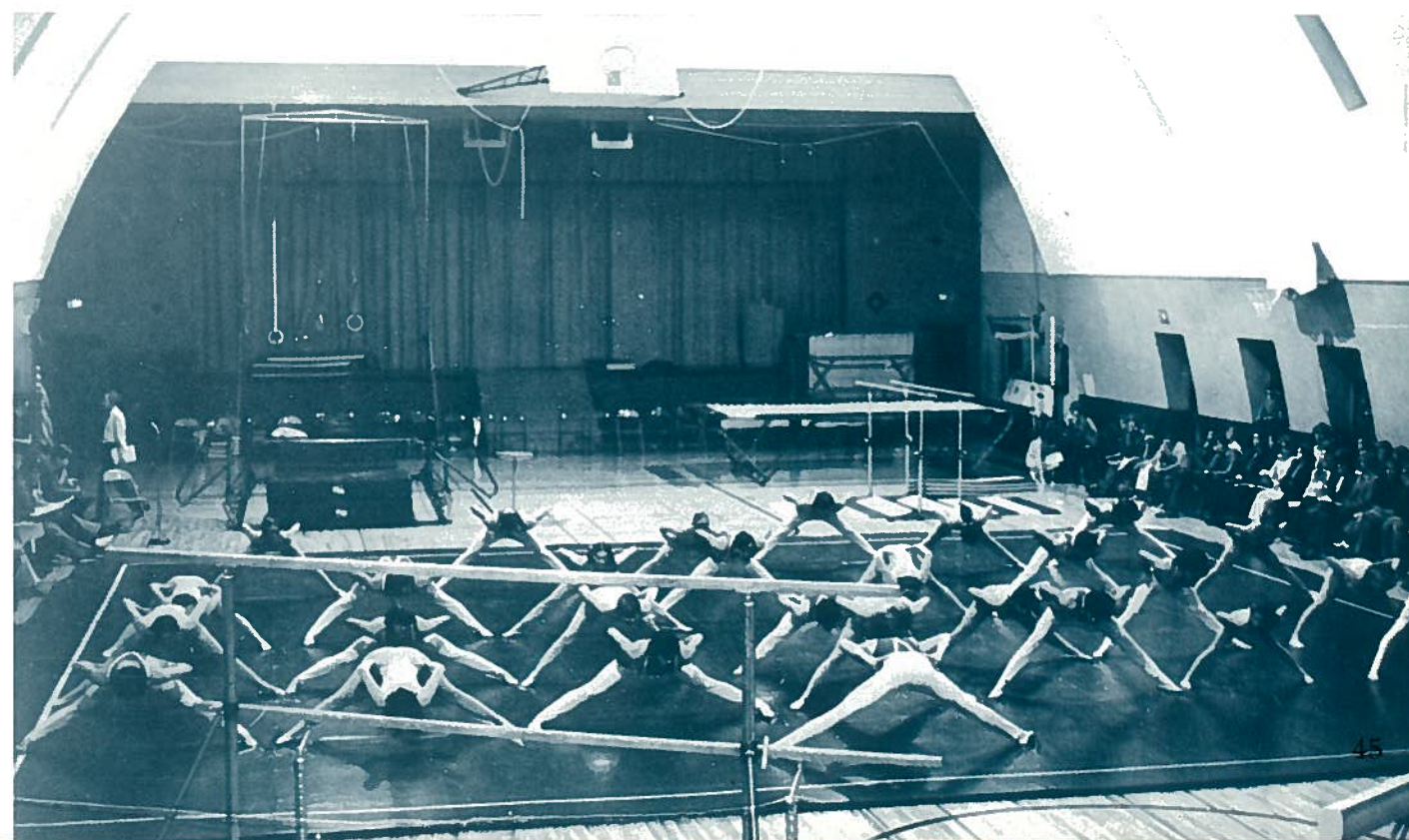


The season determines the sport

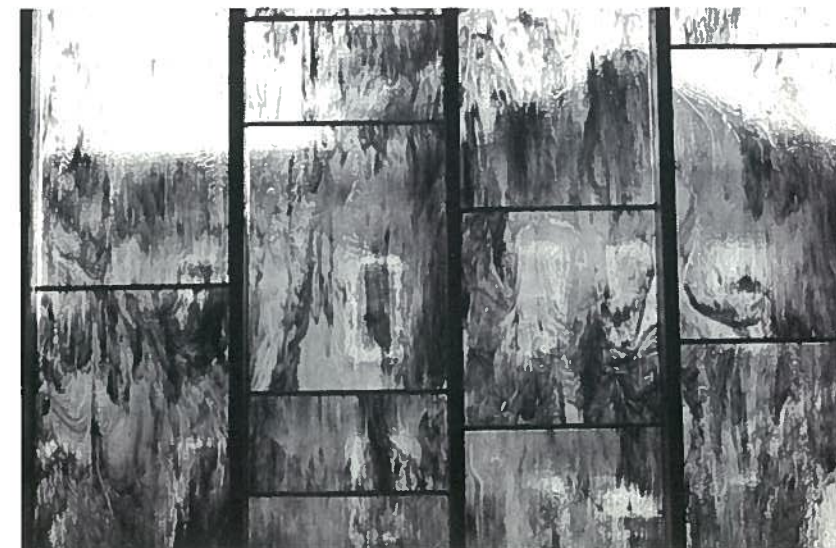
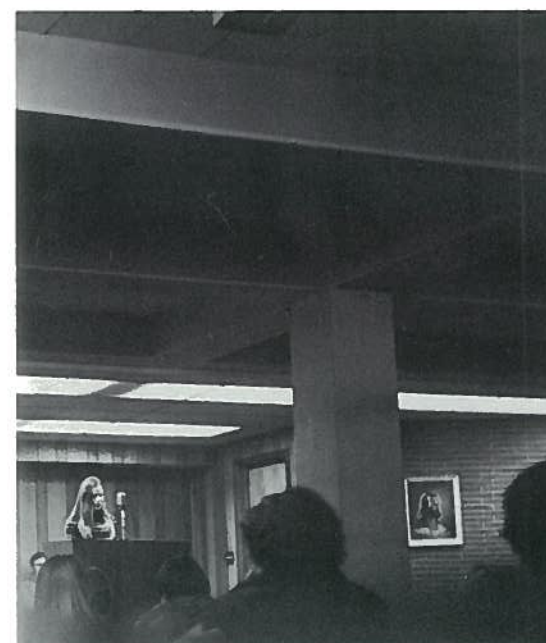

No, the communists haven't taken over the PE department. Walla Walla's tumbling team is exhibiting how to bend strong bodies twelve ways.

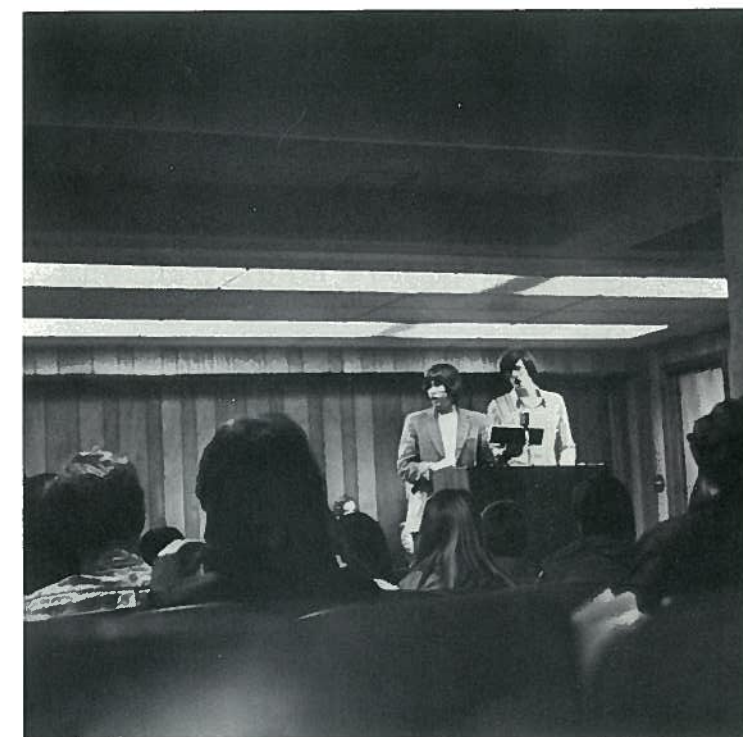


And we beheld His glory
