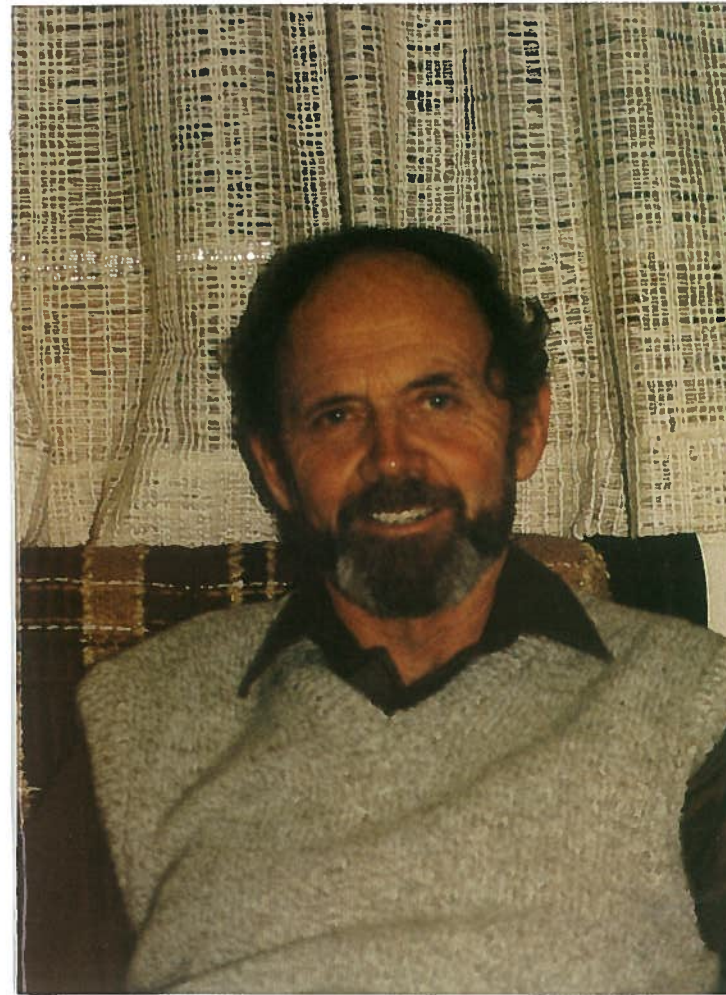

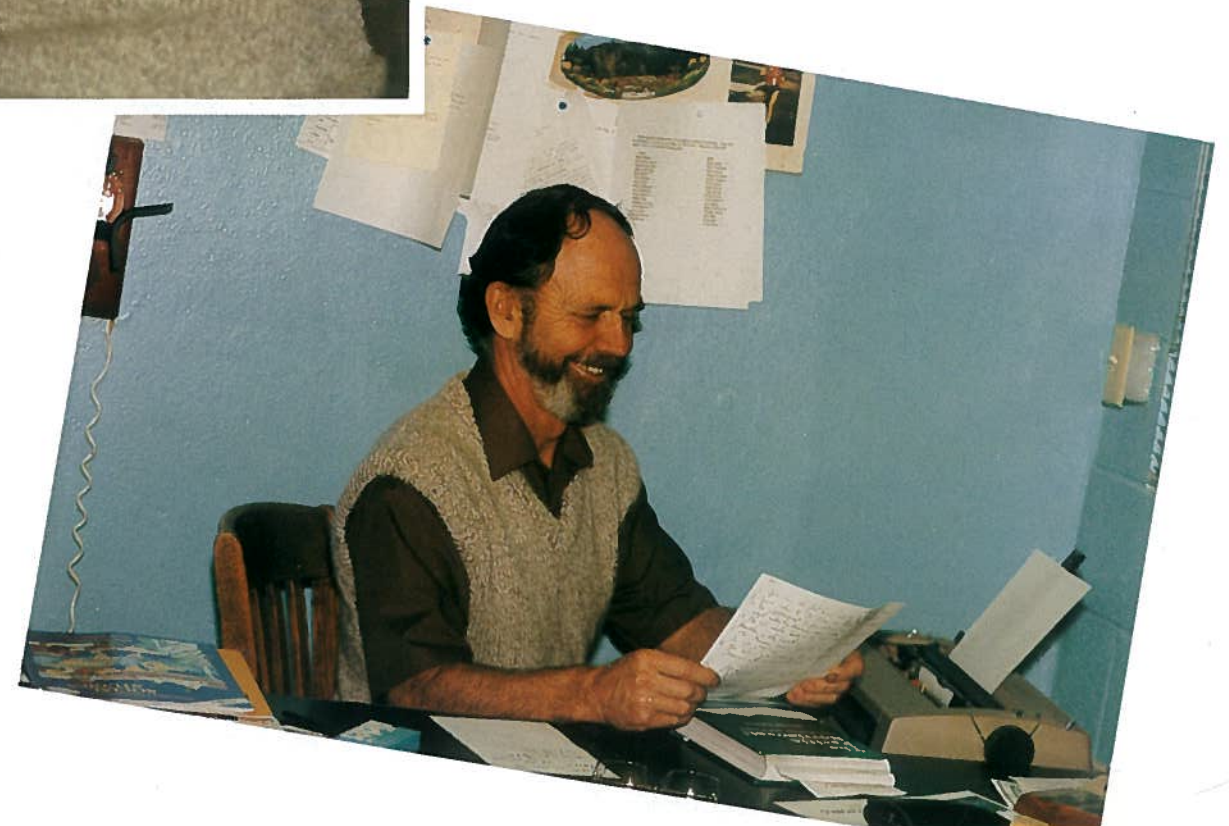

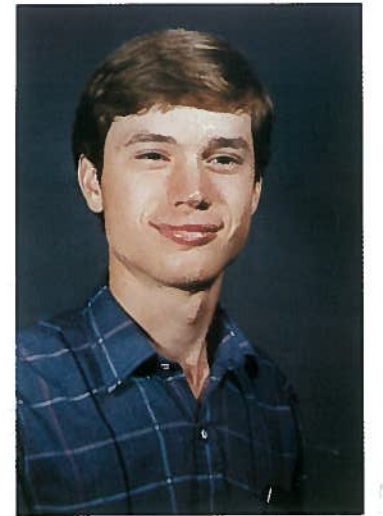

## It's About Time we became seniors

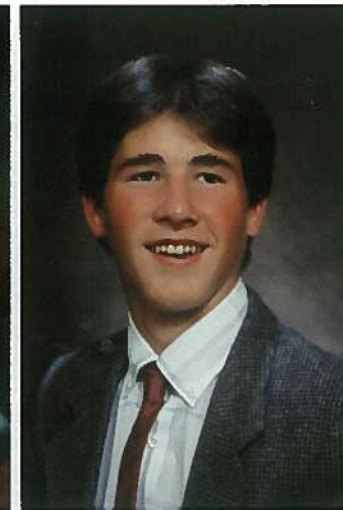

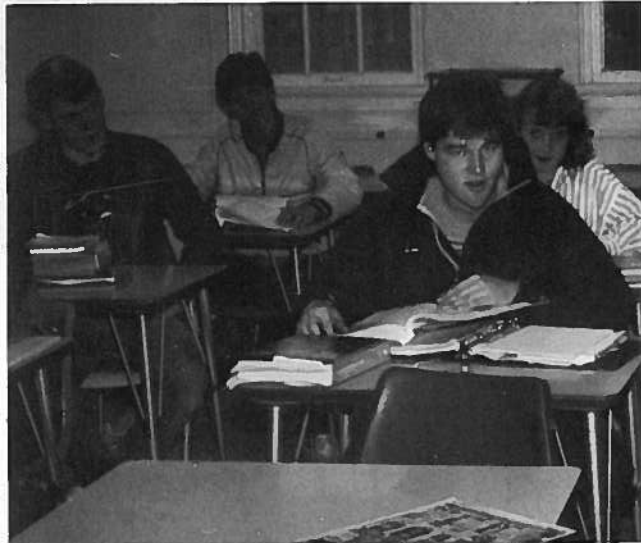


## It's About Time for Junior spirit

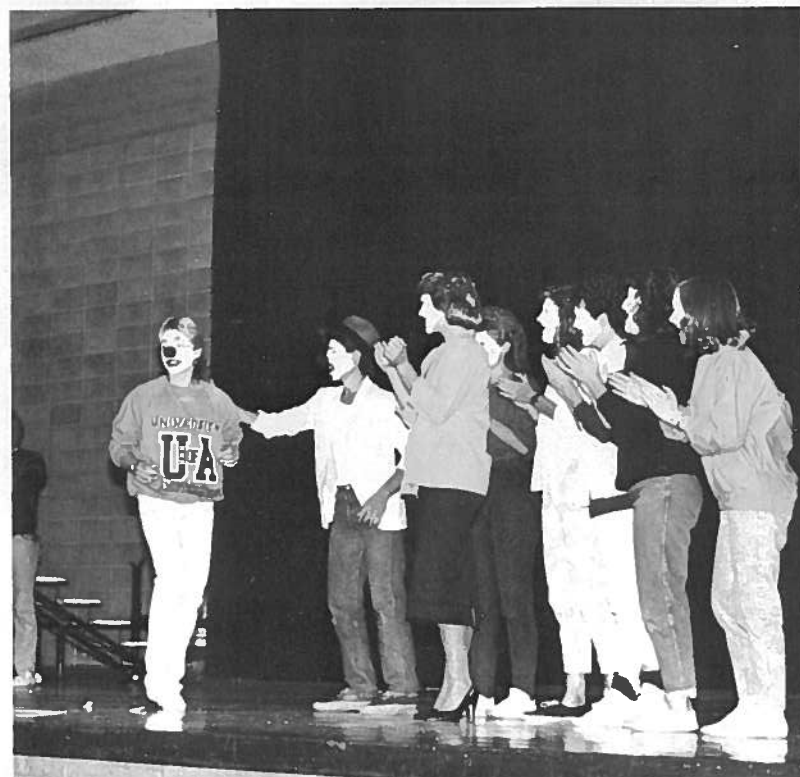
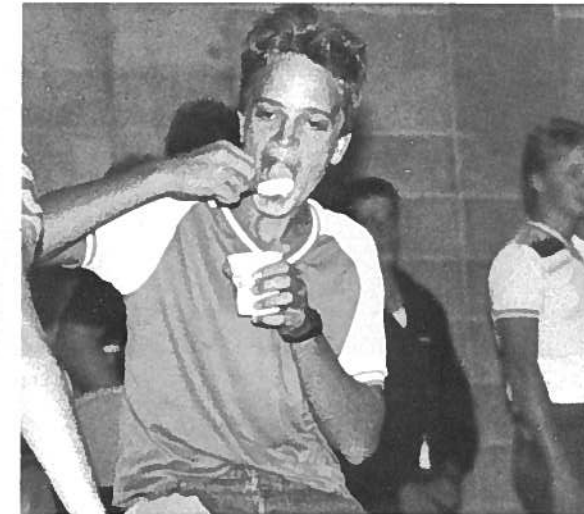


# It's About Time

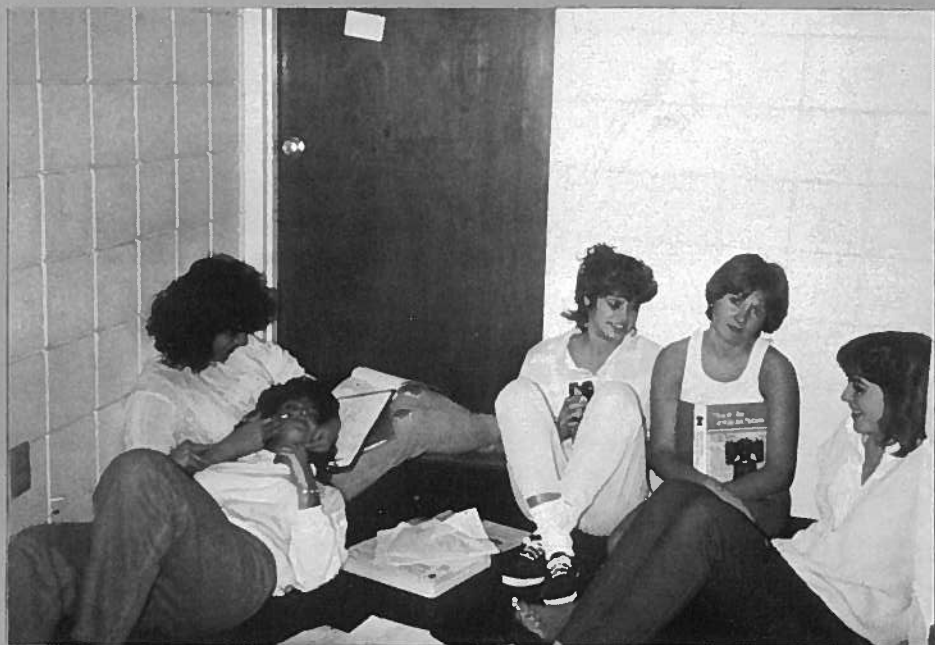
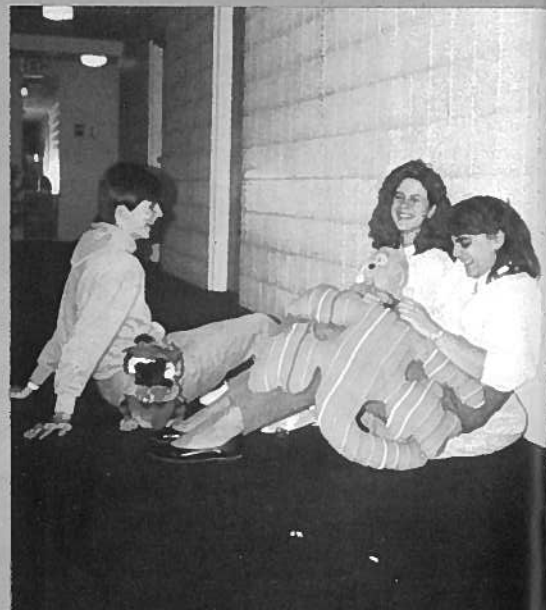






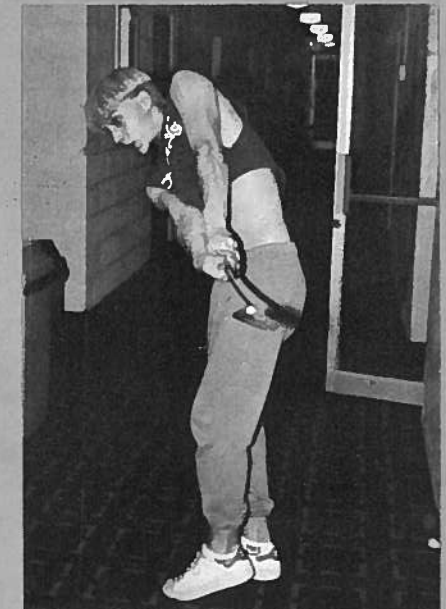
## Girl's Dorm Life

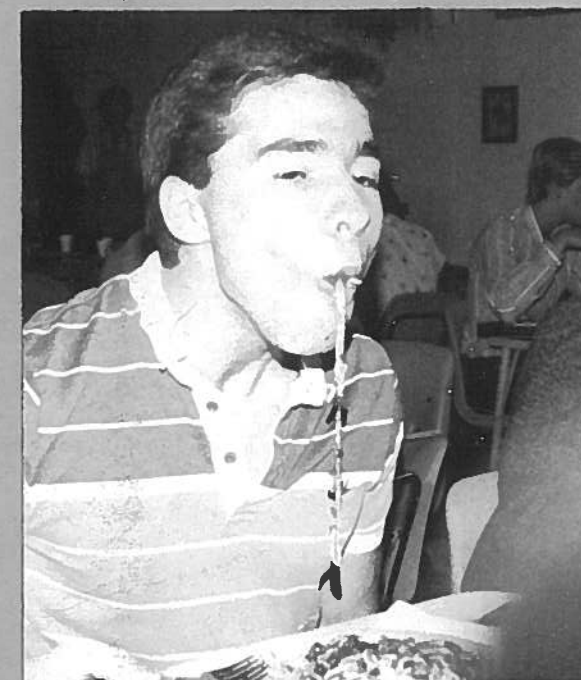
## Work

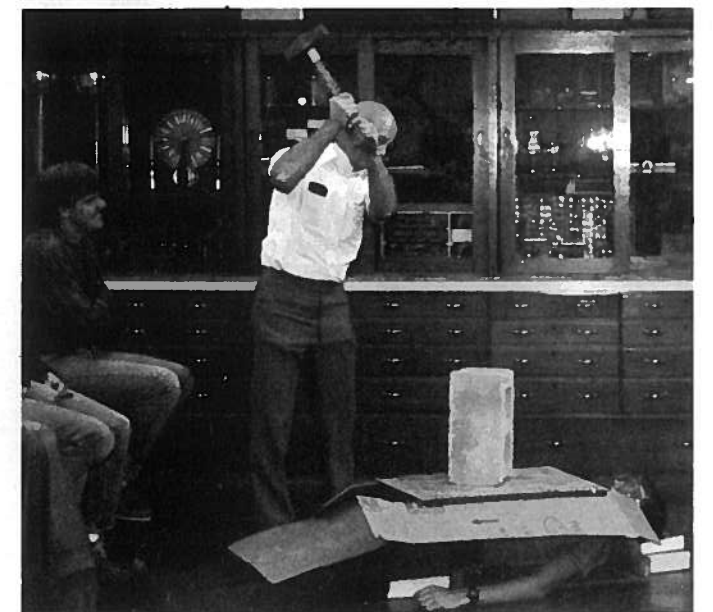
## Playperiod

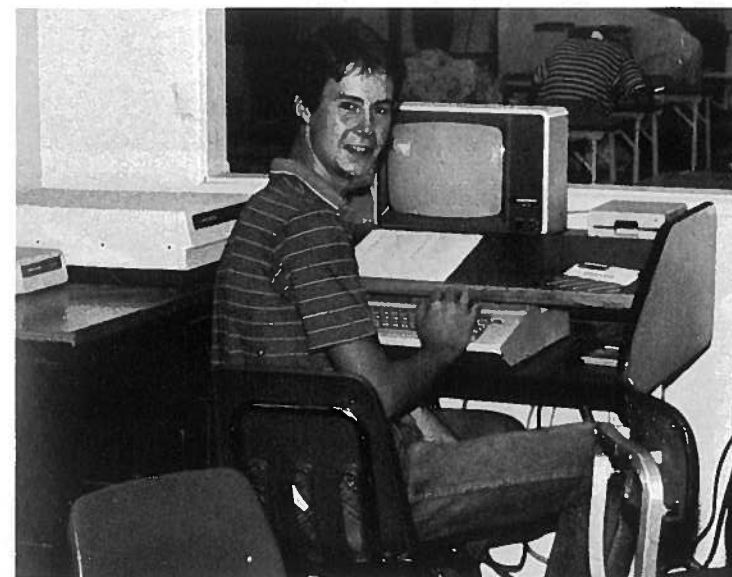
## Mathematics

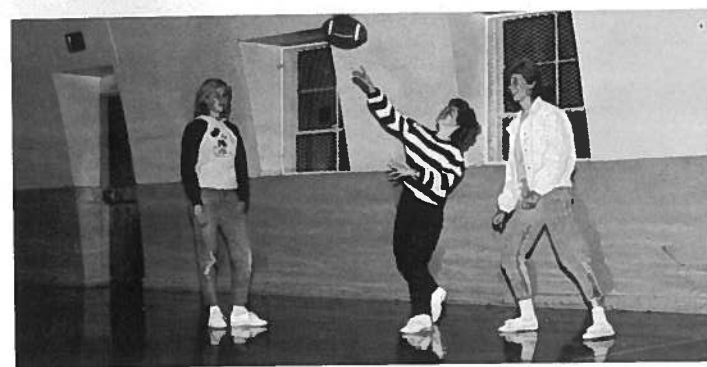
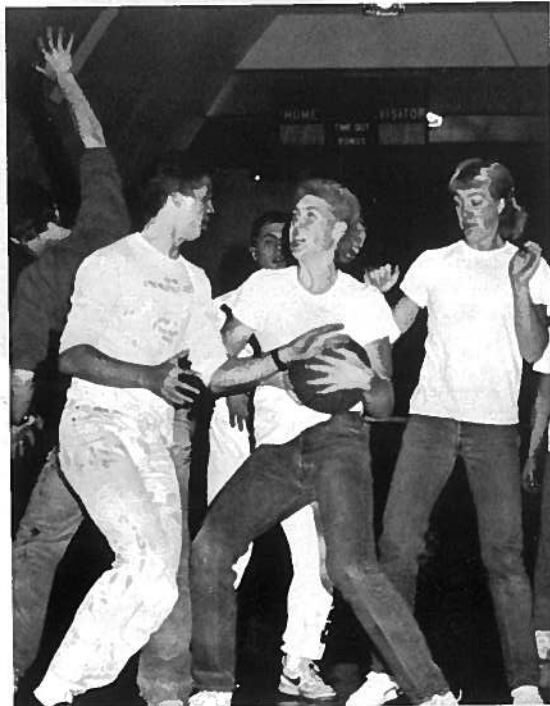
## English
