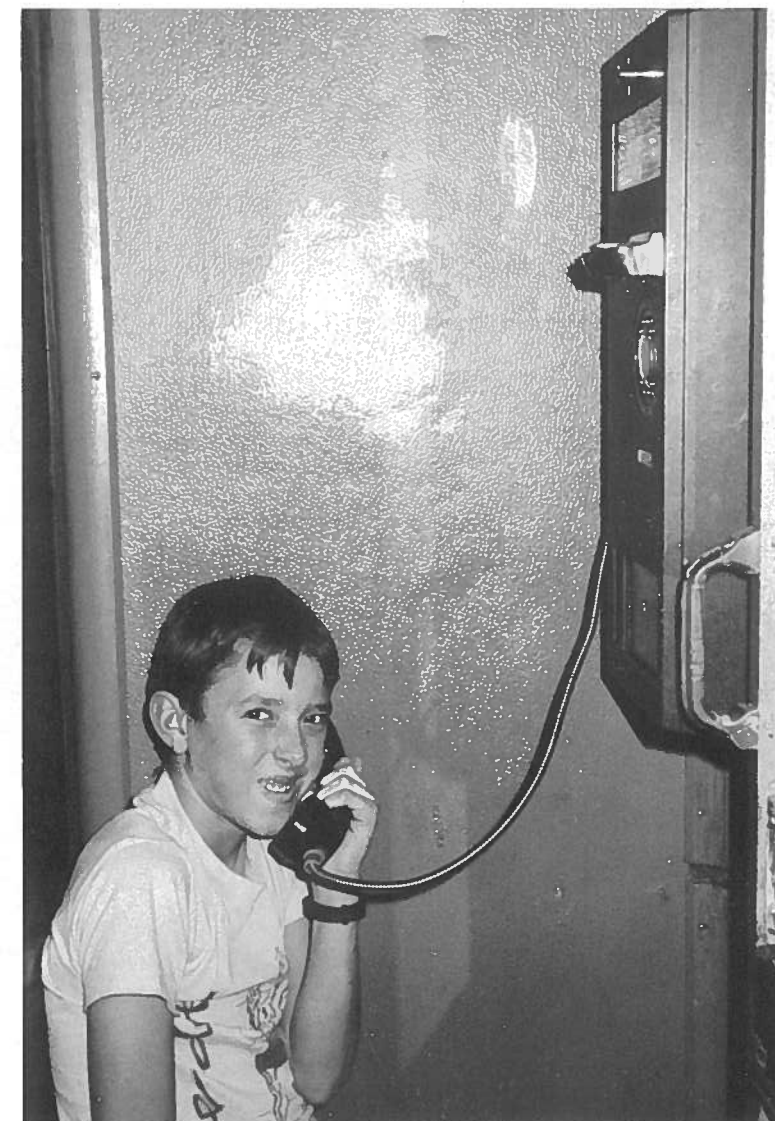
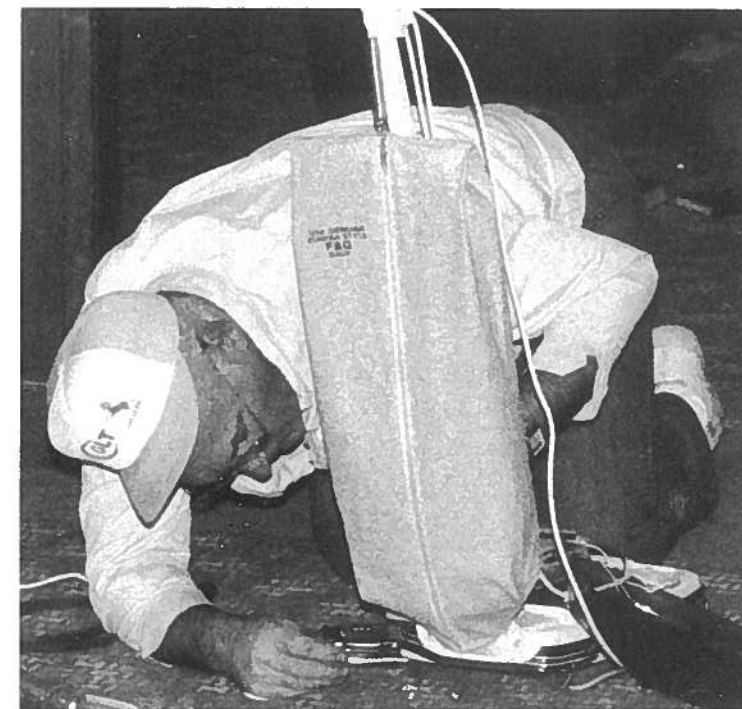




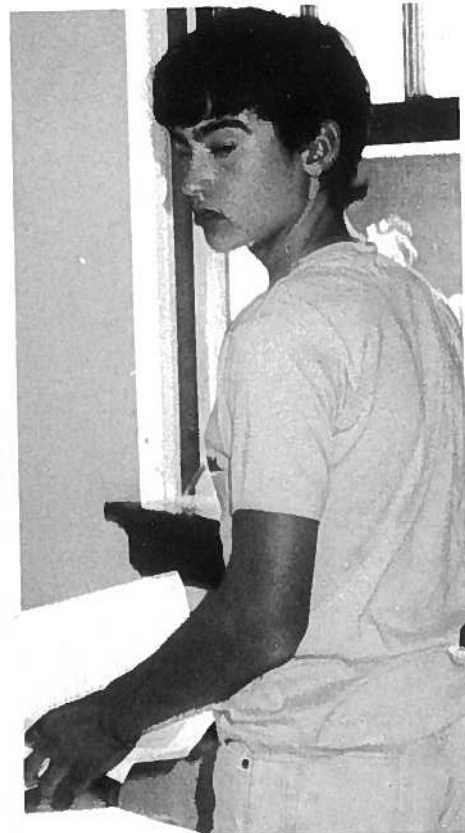
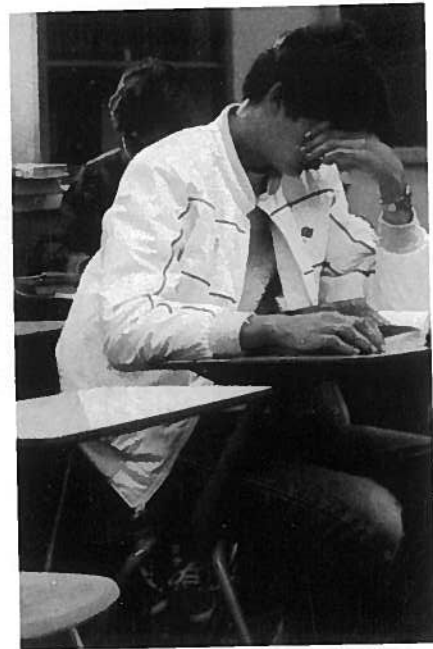
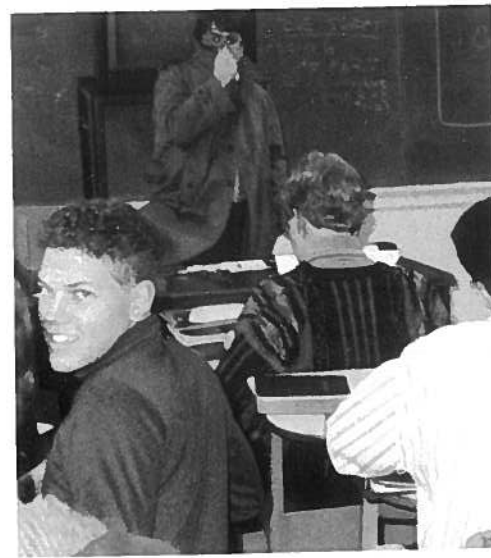
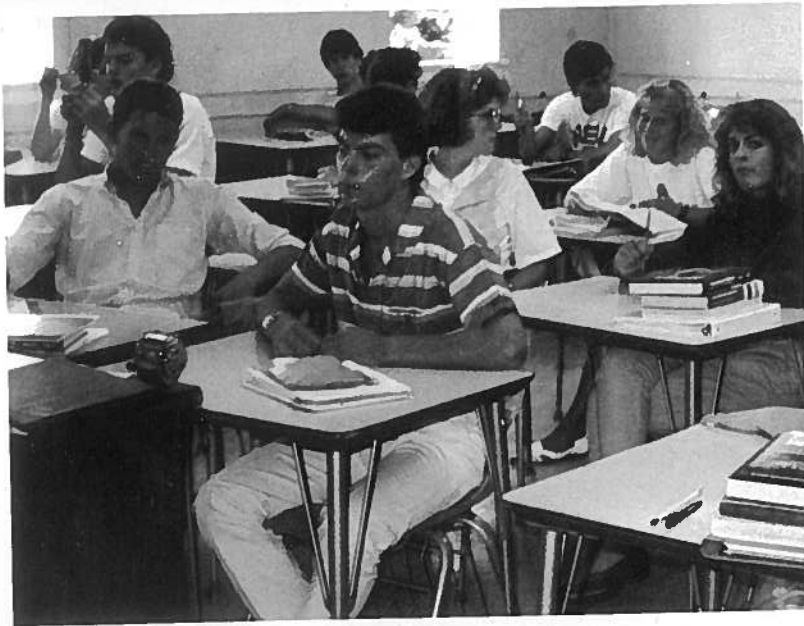


## GUYs' DORM LIFE

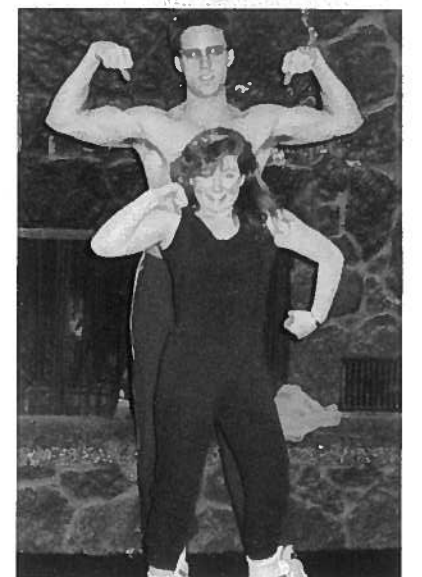




## On the Spot In the Social Scene
