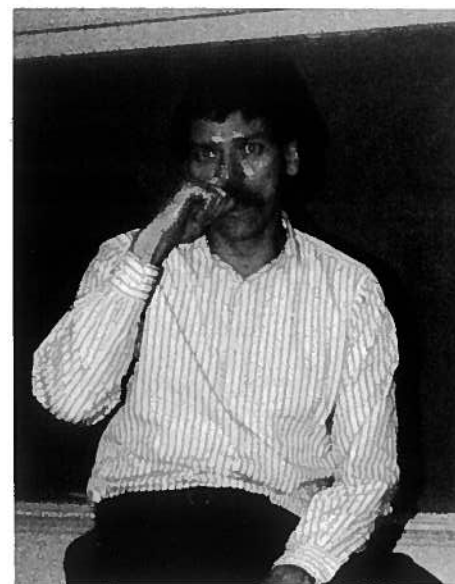
## The Faculty: Hold the Key to Our Success

At the beginning of the year, some students tried to make life here very miserable for the new faculty.

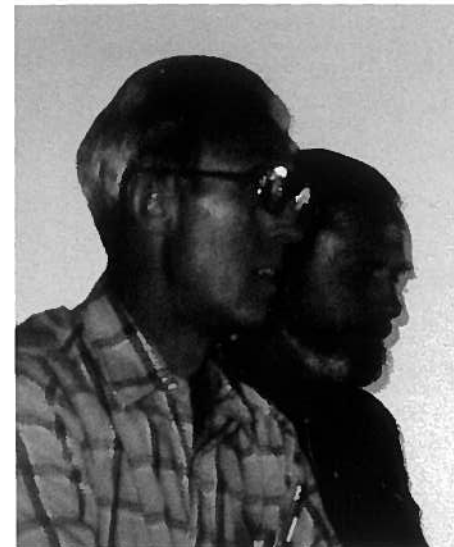
It may not have been obvious to us, but each new teacher worked hard to make this year a success for all of us. Many nights of concentration went into their well thought out lesson plans.

As the freshmen look back on this year their biggest challenge was moving in and seeing all the strange faces, within days they were making new friendships that would last, through the remainder of the schoolyear.

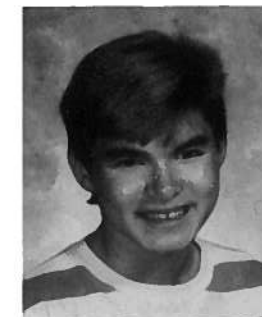

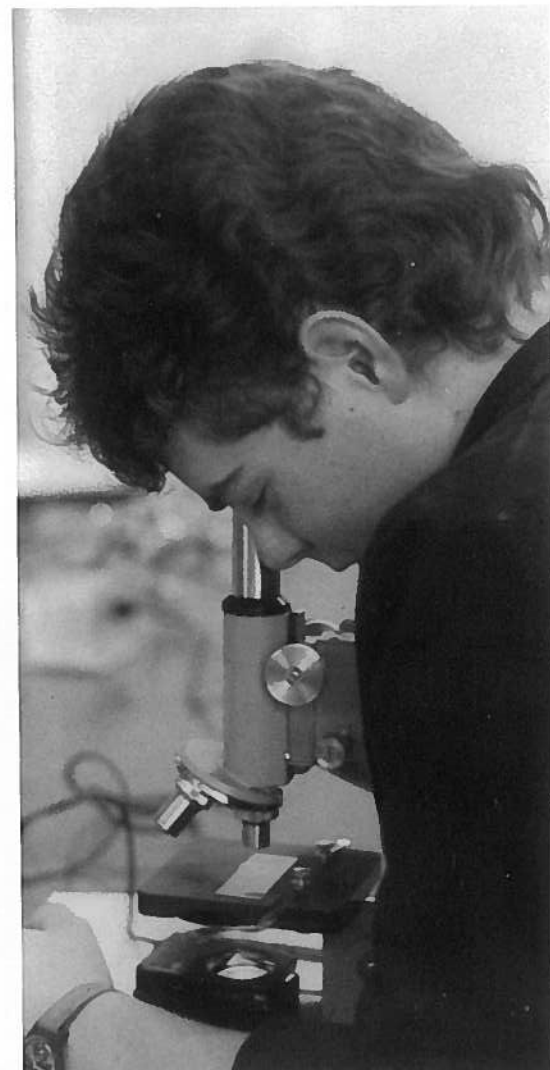

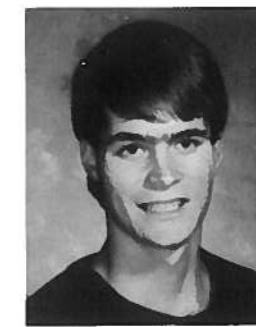
Most people consider their Freshman year or Senior year to be the most memorable, but have they forgotten the fun of being a Sophomore?

Although many people didn't realize it, a lot of planning and preparation went into making these activities a success.

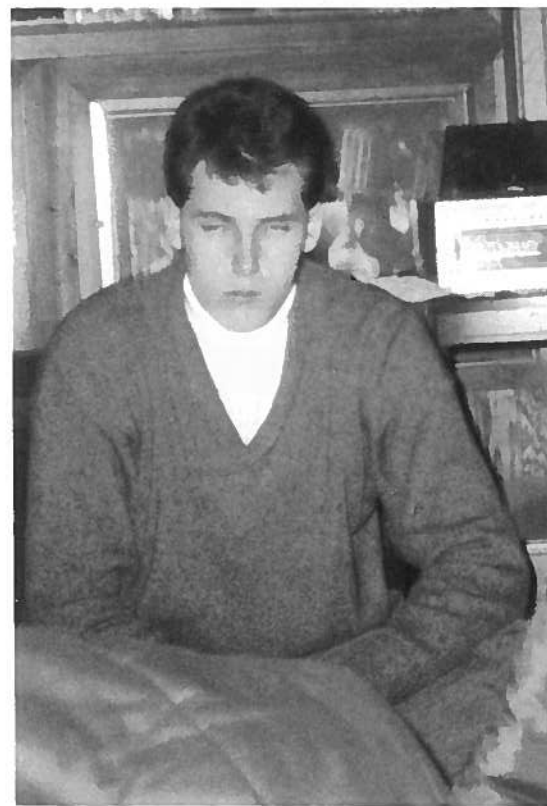

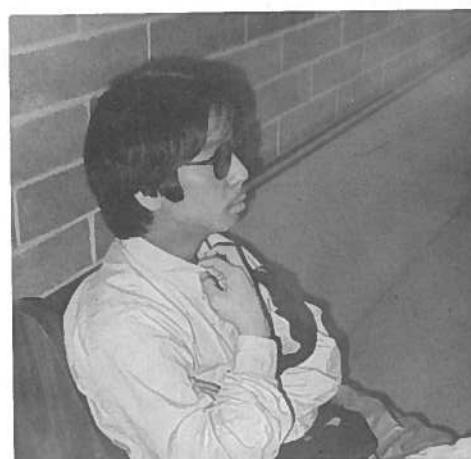




## Fall Week of Prayer

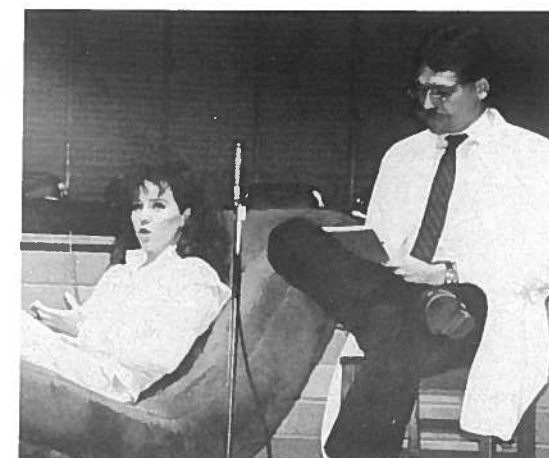
By the end of the week it was evident to us that we needed Christ, not only in our lives, but on this campus. He left us with a phrase we will not soon forget: "Why am I so . . ."



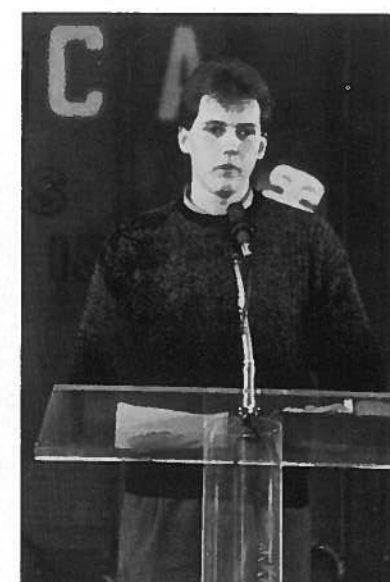

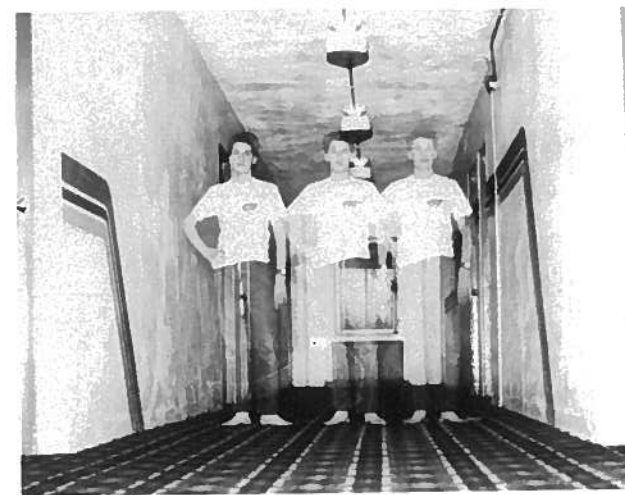
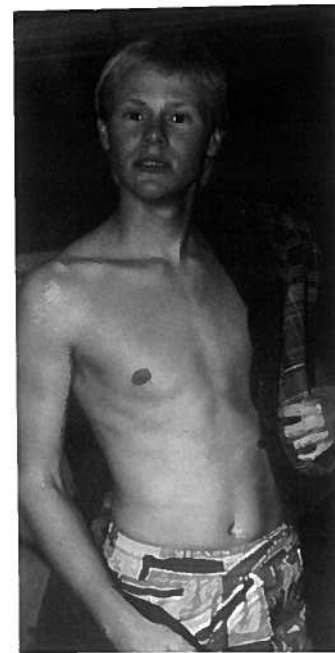




# Boy's Dorm Life

This annual has locked the memories and you are the key to your memories !!!

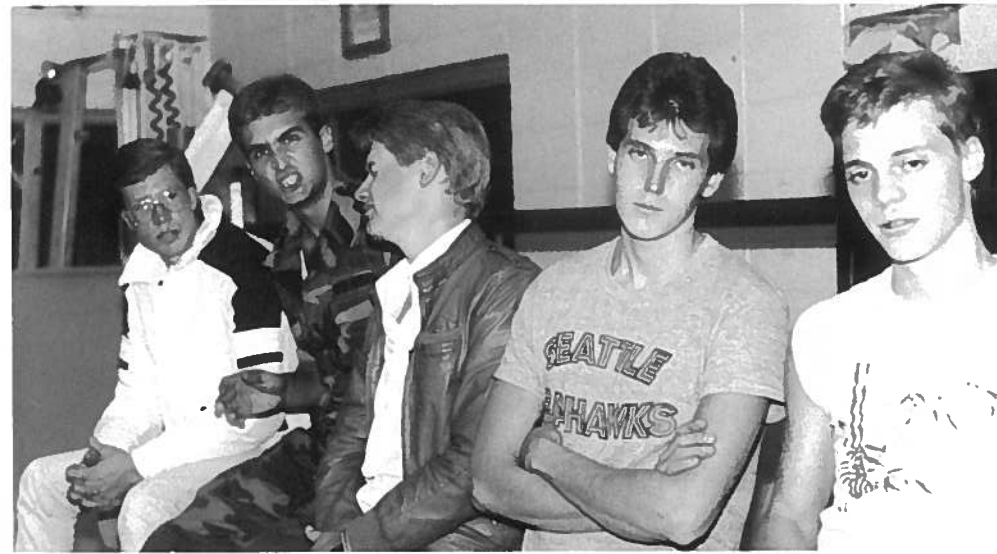
