

At the beginning of the year, some students tried to make life here very miserable for the new faculty.


It may not have been obvious to us, but each new teacher worked hard to make this year a success for all of us. Many nights of concentration went into their well thought out lesson plans.


The faculty worked hard to make this the best Christian campus, by opening their homes and hearts to us.

By the end of the week it was evident to us that we needed Christ, not only in our lives, but on this campus. He left us with a phrase we will not soon forget: "Why am I so . . . "
































Christmas Banquet
