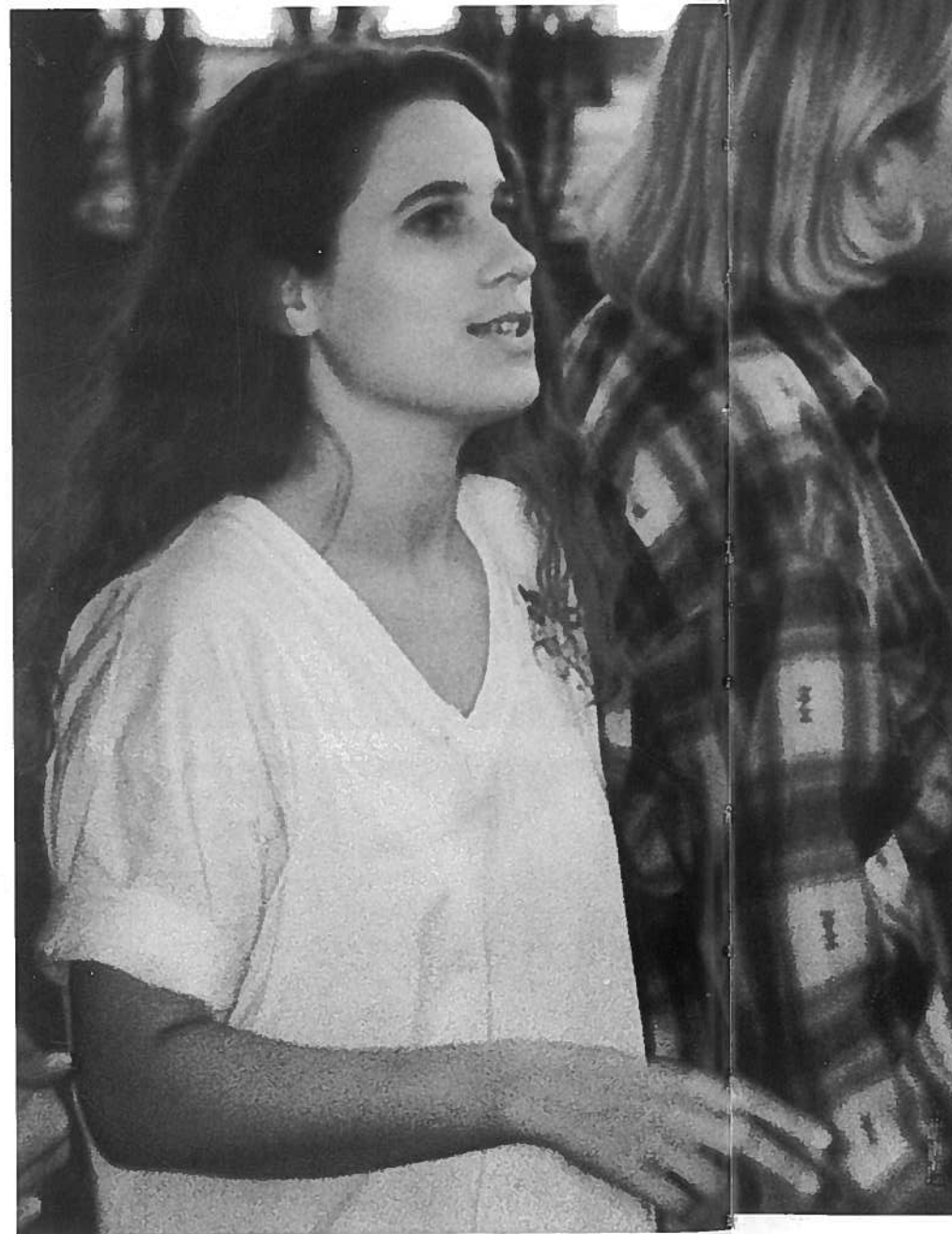
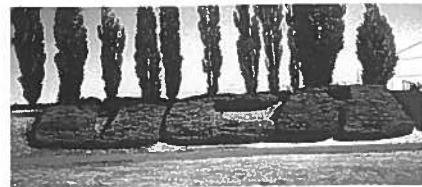
And so the day continues;

not have it jeopardize your stay here."

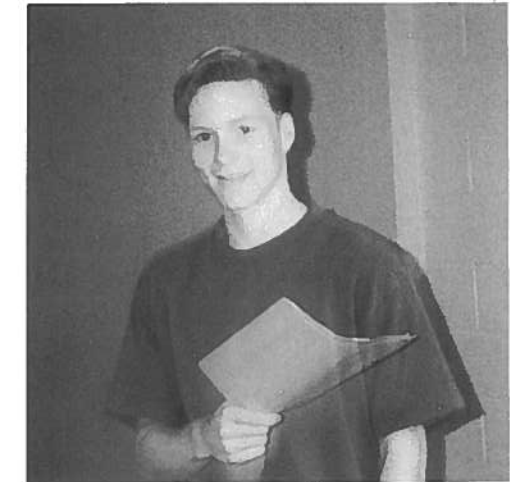
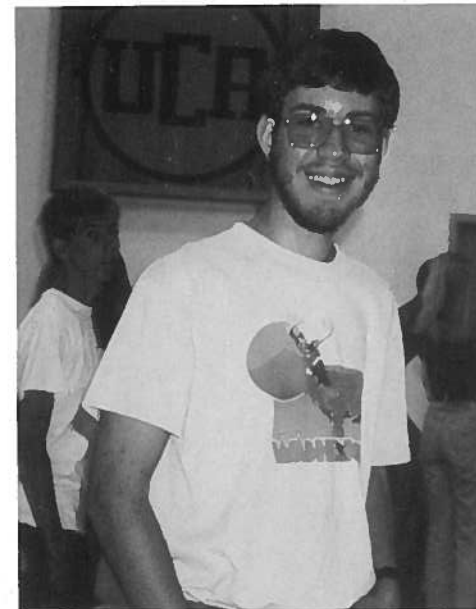

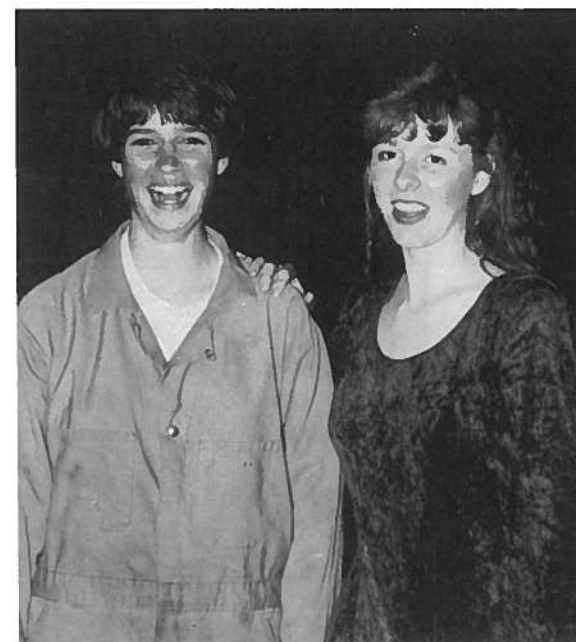

men and granola bars). Sev-

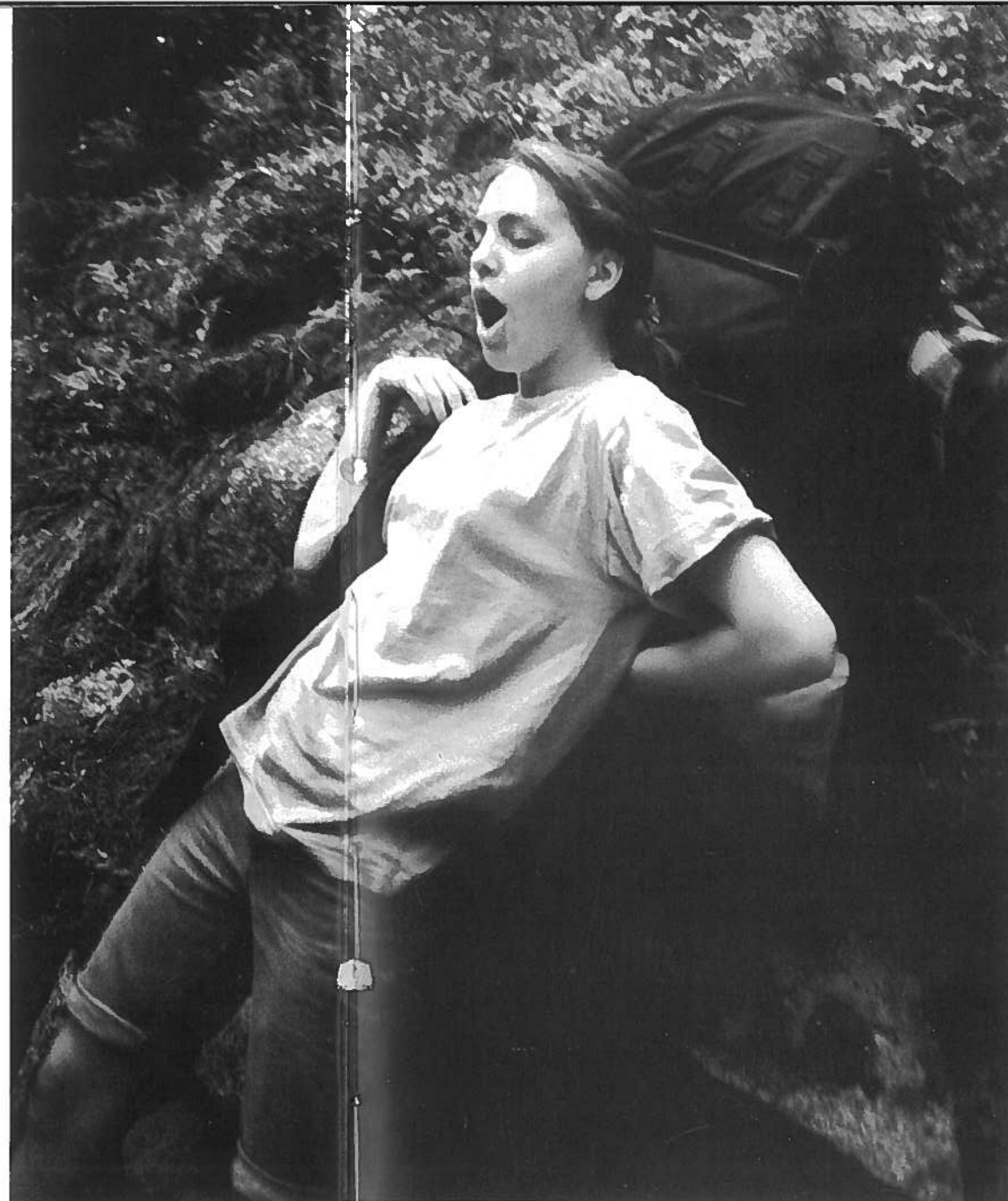

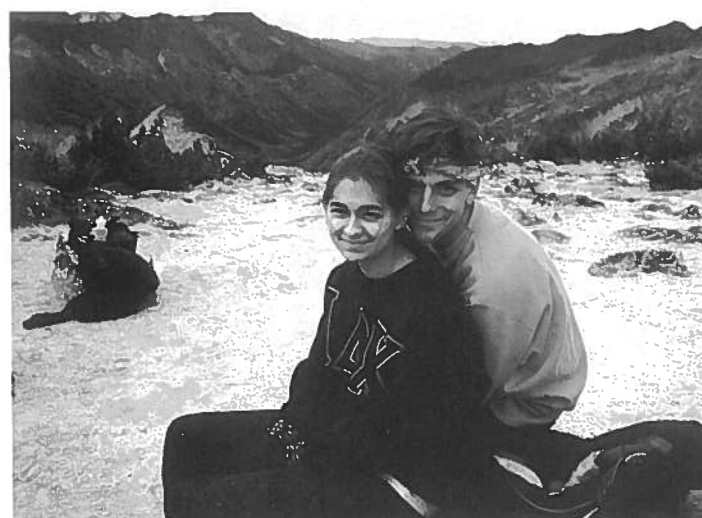

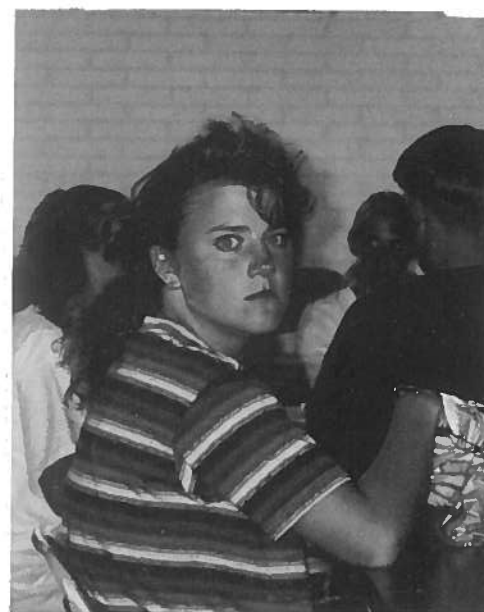

The only negative quote we heard was left anonymous, and Anonymous said that village kids don't get informed about events coming up.

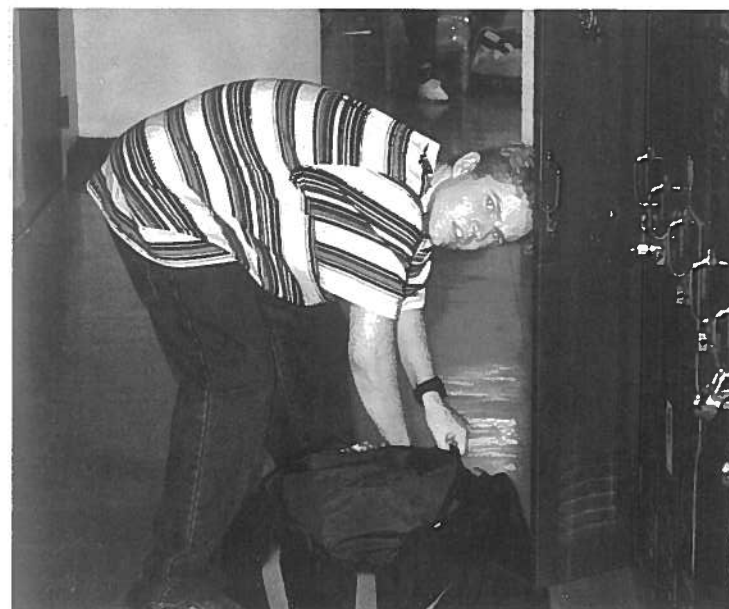

Although Seniors are known for having the least amount of stress at UCA, many really do have deep thoughts on their minds.



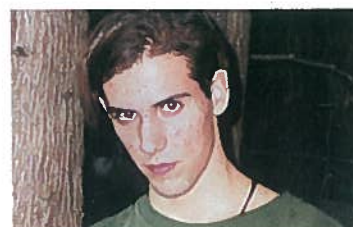

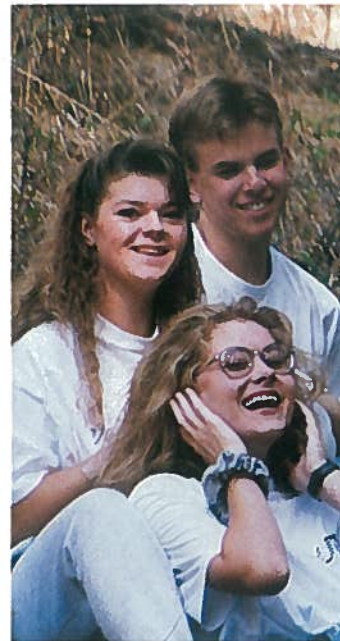

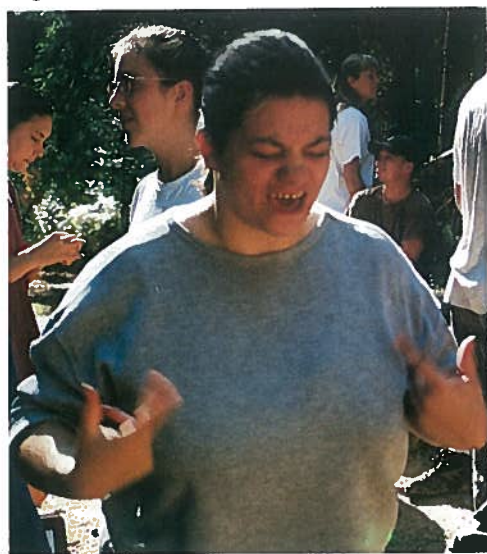

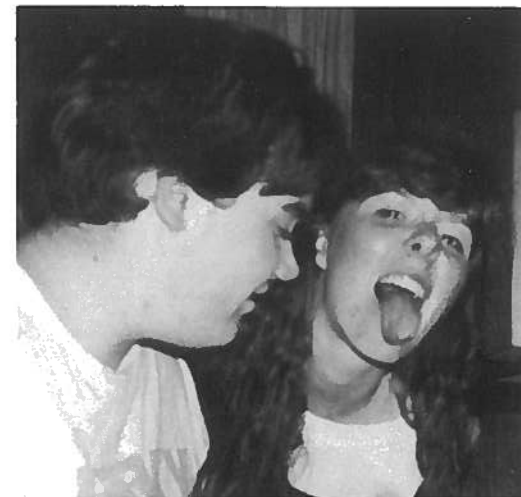

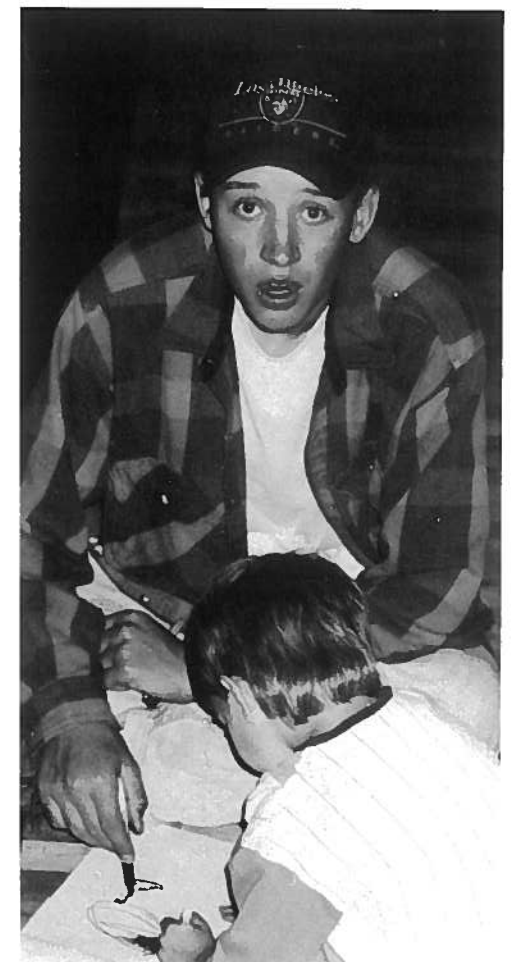
When the Freshmen are looking for a place to hide from the upper-classmen, we're sighing in relief and thanking God that we've finally passed through all that stuff.

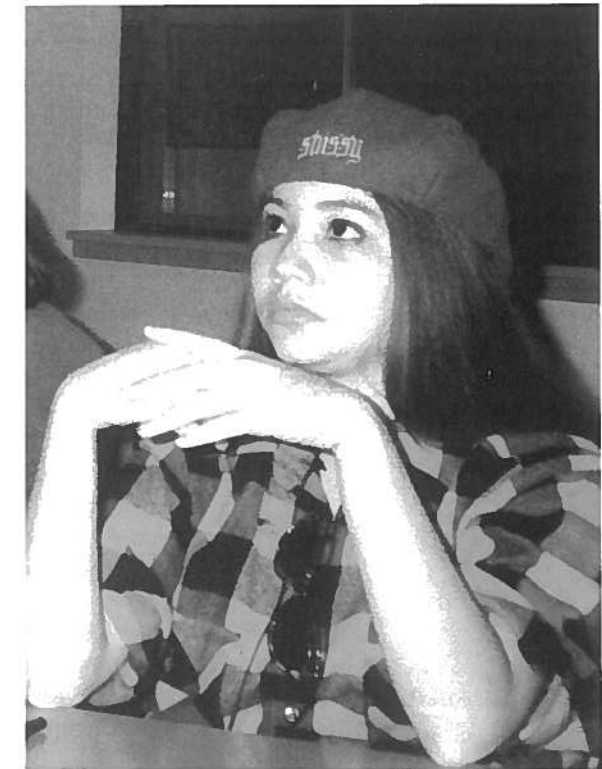

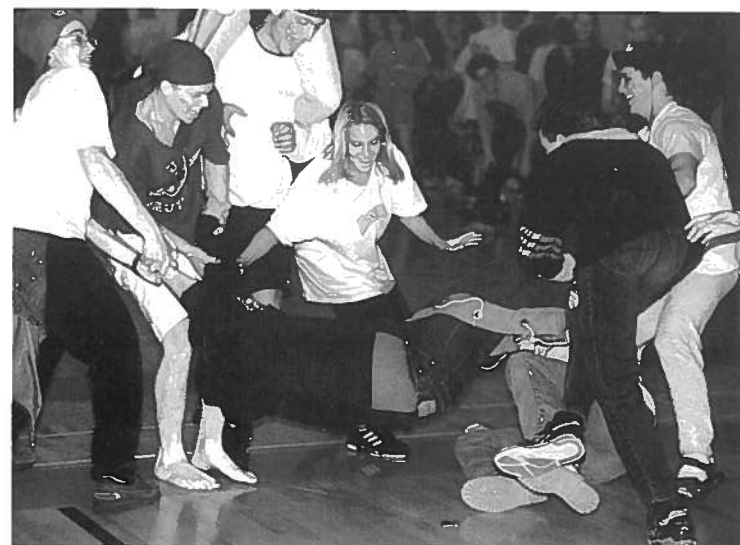
Faculty on the Map

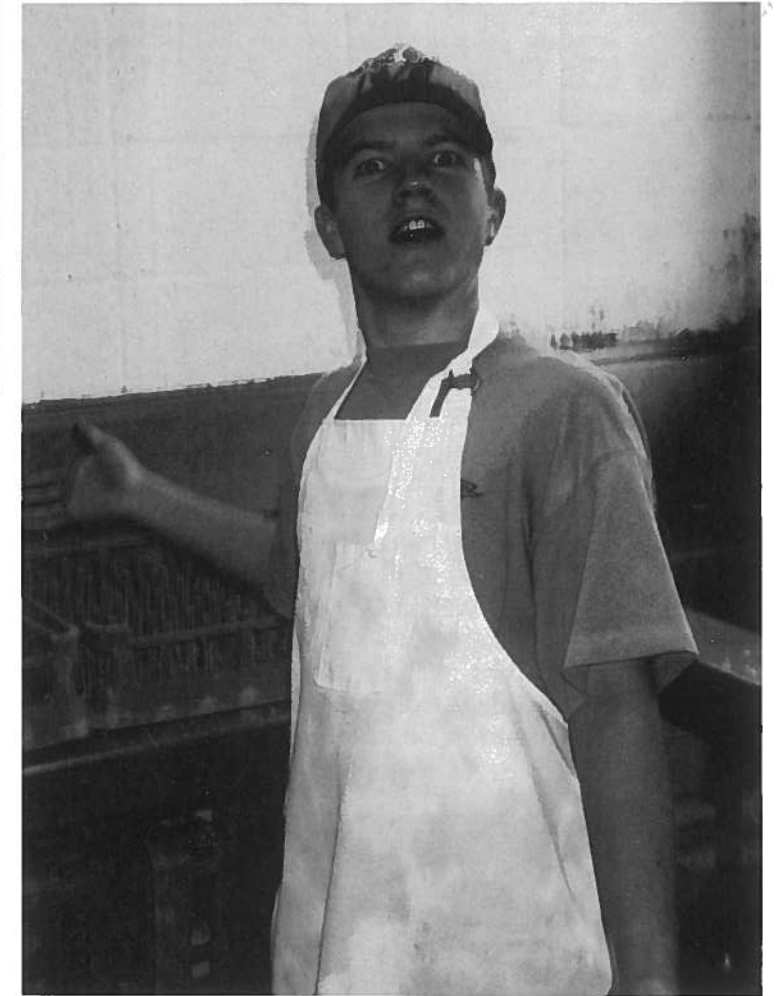

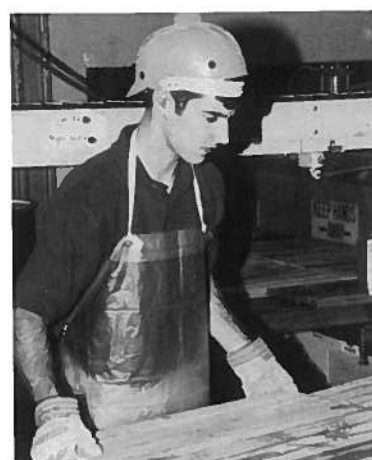

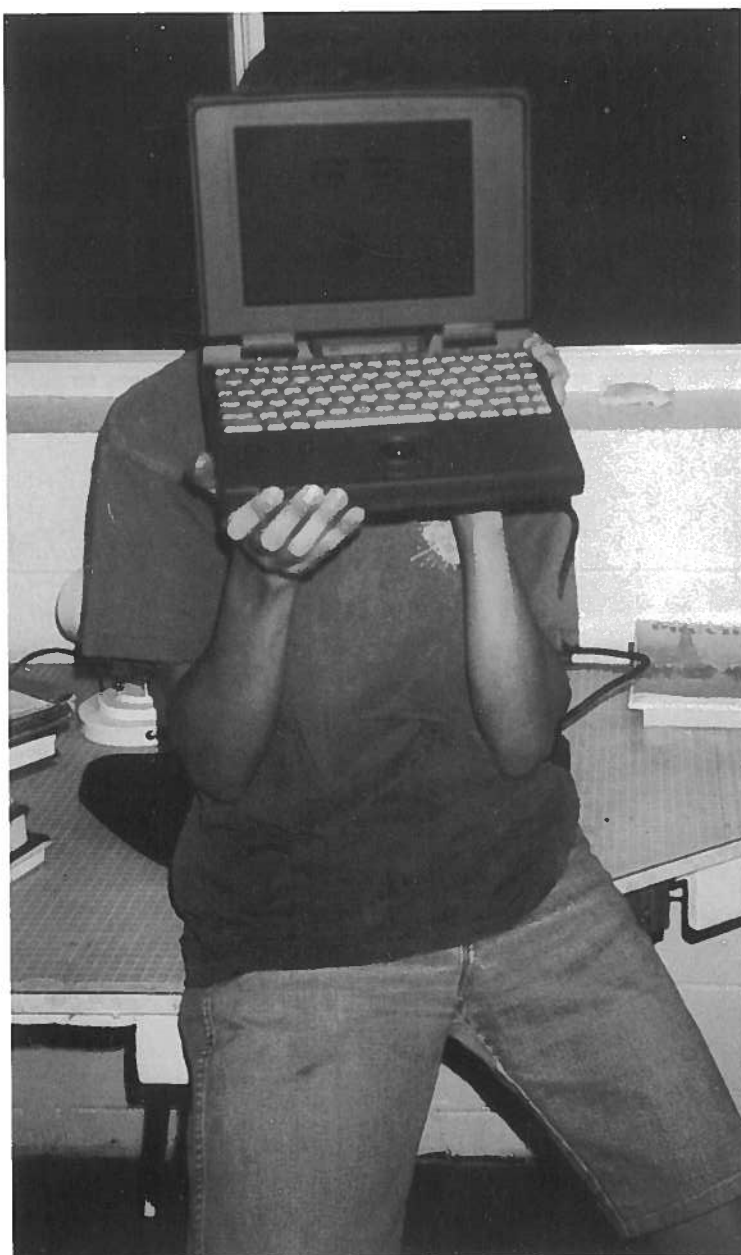
OFFICE JOBS!

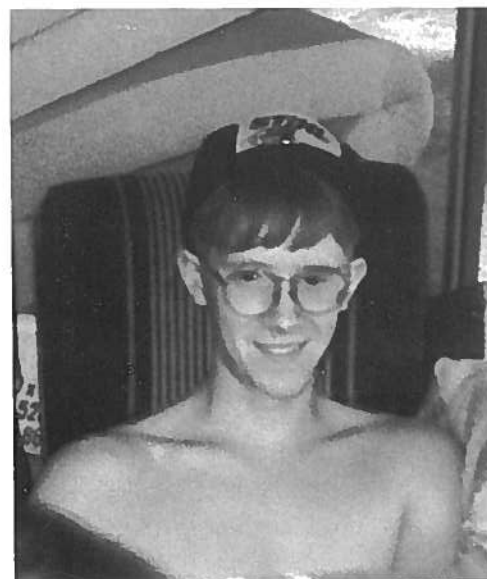

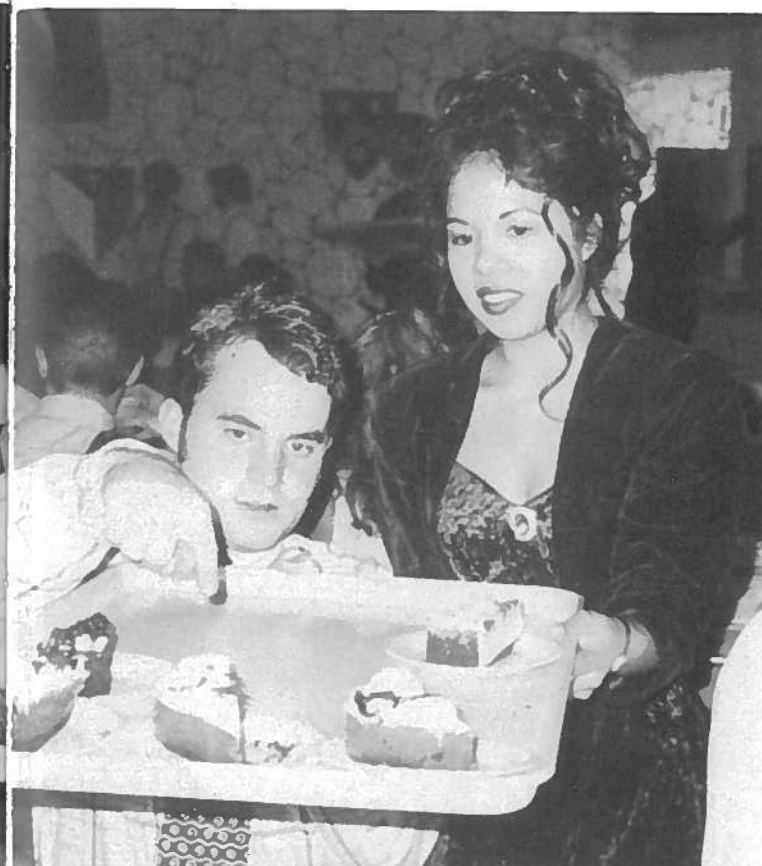

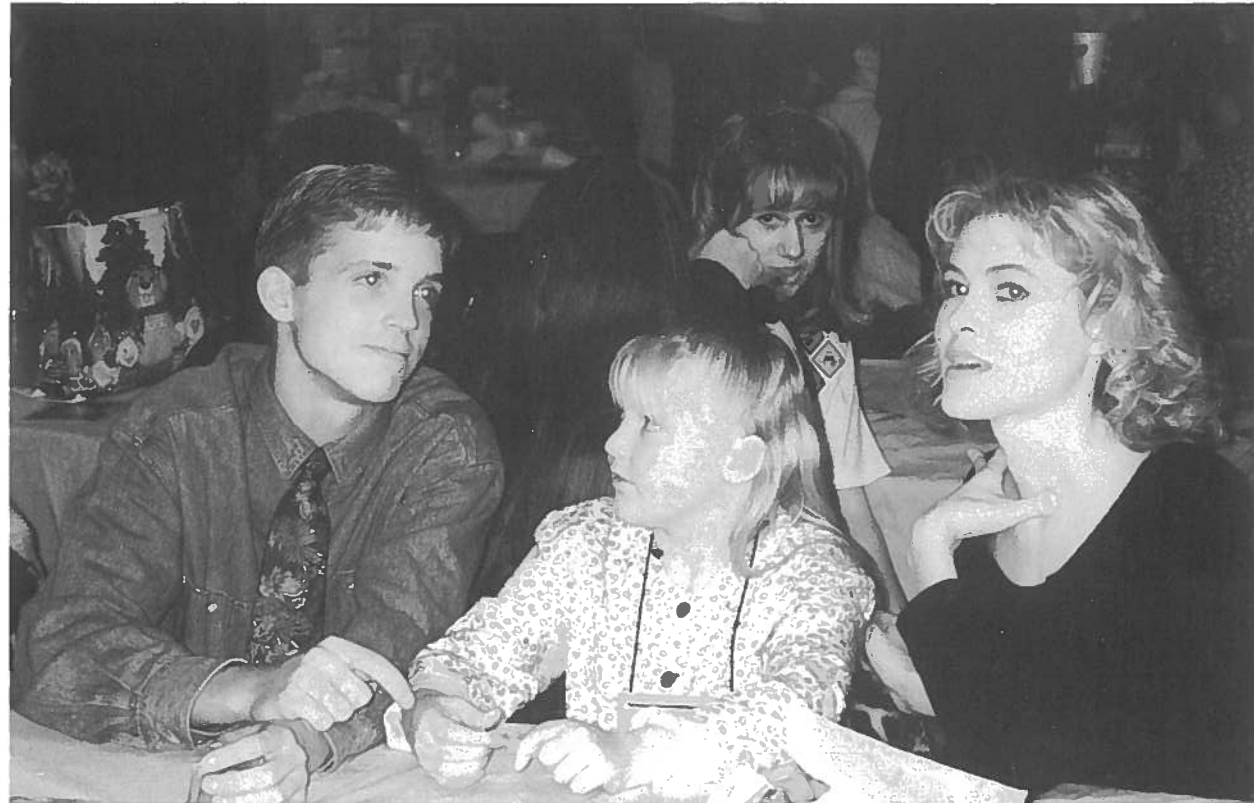

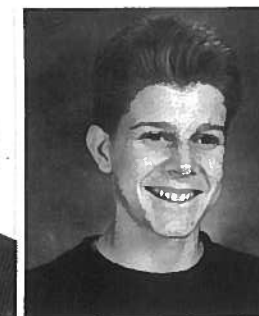
A Little Piece of Home

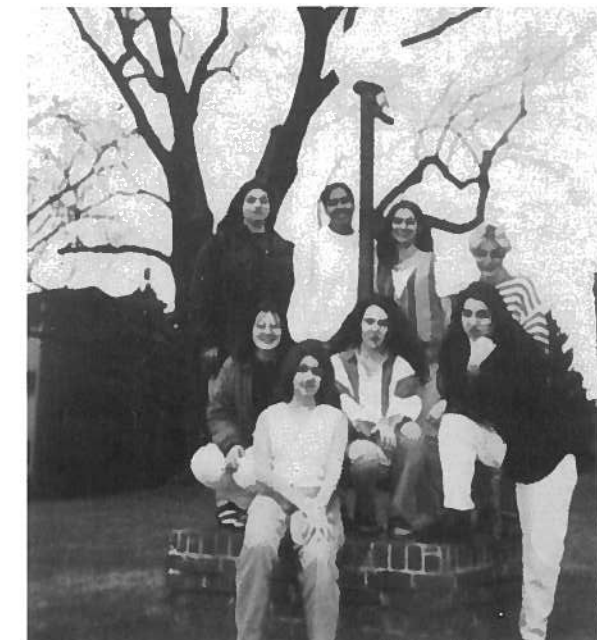

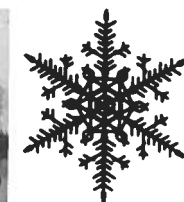
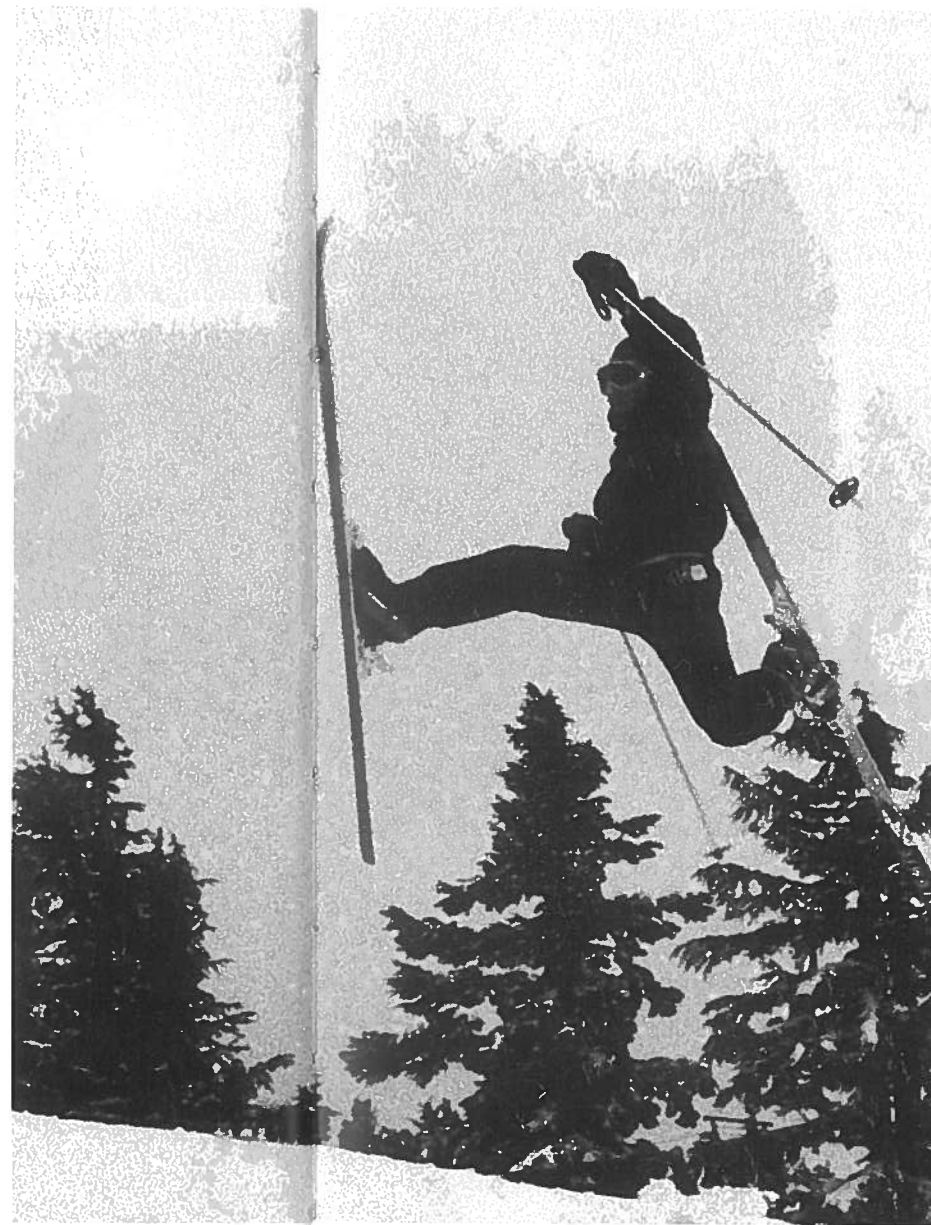
WIPEOUT!!!!
